Seven schools had two recipients each. They were: Andover, Belmont Hill, Central Catholic, Concord-Carlisle, Danvers, Milton Academy, and Xaverian Brothers.

Scholar-Athlete Selection Committee, and has been a member of the Chapter's Board of Directors for decades.



Guadagnloi, a native of Framingham, Mass., started every game at quarterback for Bentley the past three seasons. He passed for 9,170 yards and 69 touchdowns. A two year captain, he set the Bentley single season passing yardage records in both 2013 and 2014. He was named the 2014 Northeast-10 Offensive Player of the Year and the Agannis/Zinman Award by the New England Football Writers as the top senior football player in New England.

In the classroom, Guadagnoli received his Bachelor's Degree in Economics-Finance in 2014 and is currently pursuing a Master's Degree in Finance. He graduated Magna Cum Laude and was a member of the Bentley Falcon Society, the highest academic honor for a Bentley undergraduate.

Guadagnoli has on ongoing leadership position with the Team IMPACT program, involved with a young boy with a severe immune deficiency. He has also worked with a non-profit tutoring organization called Pox Populi, a service that tutors university students in Afghanistan through Skype. His community service activities also include working with the Leukemia and Lymphoma society, the Relay for Life and a homeless veterans shelter.

Dr. Kovatch was an outstanding two-way tackle at Princeton University from 1951-1954 where he played with former Grinold Chapter member Heisman Trophy winner Dick Kazmeier. He received his Bachelor of Science in Engineering from Princeton and several years later attended Cornell University where his studies resulted in a Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering in 1962.

Dr. Kovatch worked professionally for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in Cambridge, Mass. He was head of a division dealing with control systems projects for space vehicles and served as Chief of the Office of Control Theory and Application (OCTA). When NASA's research center in Cambridge became the Transportation Systems Center (TSC), a part of the U.S. Department of Transportation, he joined the DOT as a director of research for advanced transportation systems.

Dr. Kovatch and his wife, Susan, made their home in Hingham where they raised their four children. He was active in Princeton Alumni of New England (PANE) serving as chairman of the Schools Committee and as President of the organization. Following his retirement, the Kovatches relocated to Cape Cod.

Extremely active in Irish and Irish-American affairs, Haughey serves as chairman of the Friends of Celtic Studies at both Harvard and Boston College, and the Friends of the Boston Irish Famine Memorial. He is a past chairman of the Boston Chapter of the Irish American Cultural Institute and in 2005 was awarded an honorary degree from the University of Ulster.

Haughey is currently Chairman of IMEC (International Medical Equipment Collaborative) providing third world caregivers with the tools of health, education and agriculture to serve their communities. He also runs a family real estate investment, development and management business in New England.
