

# WOULD YOU RELAY THAT ONE MORE TIME?

A relay controlling a relay, which controls a relay! Does this sound confusing? It is, but it could be worse. Now days every device is probably controlled by some type of relay, it may be an on delay, off delay, interval delay, etc. This is probably associated with "well, it worked OK on the blueprint", but we'll poke fun at this later. There are a multitude of variations available, I'll try to cover a few of the most common along with how they operate and some typical uses of such.

#### ON DELAY


For an On Delay timing relay, the time delay begins when control power is applied. When the time delay has elapsed, the output contacts will energize. Typically, the control power must be removed to reset the relay. This type of relay could be used where a pneumatic actuated valve is installed on the suction or discharge side of a pump, and you would want time for this valve to open before the pump starts.

#### **OFF DELAY**

For an off delay timing relay, the control power must be applied continuously. When a normally open control switch is closed, the output contacts are energized. When the time delay has elapsed the output contacts will de-energize. A typical application would be when you want the primary chilled water pump(s) to run X amount of time after the chillers stop to prevent any freezing of the tubes.

#### **ONE SHOT**

For a Momentary Input Interval timing relay, the control power must be applied continuously. When a normally open control switch is momentarily closed, the time delay begins and the output contacts energize. When the time delay has elapsed, the output contacts will deenergize. Installations of this type of relay my be found in most shunt trip circuits, older generation pH controllers and time delaying the parking garage gates after a vehicle enters the detection area.



#### INTERVAL

For a Maintained Input Interval timing relay, the time delay begins and the output contacts energize when the control power is applied. When the time delay has elapsed, the output contacts will energize. Control power must be removed in order to reset the relay. Relays of this type may be found on infrared humidifier pan make-up valves, so that the pan has a sufficient amount of water.

#### REPEAT CYCLE

When control power is applied to the Repeat Cycle Timer the T1 off time

begins. At the end of the T1 off-time, the output contacts energize and the T2 on-time begins. At the end of the T2 on-time, the output contacts de-energize and the T1 off-time begins again. Other than the experience with this type of relay installed on autoclaves which controlled the Ethylene Oxide Carbon Dioxide (ETO), gas valves, I've not had the opportunity to find any of these relays lately, but I'm sure that is one were to place this in an On Delay socket, it could really mess up someone's day!

The multitude of variations available could throw a person into a brain lock, and trying to stock one of each may jeopardize ones budget expenses due to the vast amount of applications. If you would like to attempt to stay ahead of the ball game, and the most common relay you have is of the 11 pin variety, try getting a Syrelec Mod. LLM-2 or LLR-2.

This relay is available at a local vendor and has multiple capabilities. The time delay and type of operation are switchable by means of selector switches located on the side and the top of the relay. This means that one relay can take the place if about 10 relays which is fantastic of your budget confines you to the bare minimum for stocking spare parts, or you do not have the available space in your service van to stock all the other relays. This relay is more expensive than the designated use relays, but labor and mileage are the real savings here.


