WOLF-THEMED SLOT UNVEILED

The game-making company NetEnt has unveiled what it calls Spinsane, a 5-reel, 3-row, 27line video slot with a wolf motif. The new online slot is boosted with suspense effects randomly activated to add to the excitement of playing. Wild symbols, scatter symbols, regular symbols, super symbols and blank spaces can appear on the reels, and enhance payouts and increase the fun factor according to the game creators. Super symbols include a wolf face with claw marks, a paw print with claw marks, and more.

GAMBLERS TAKE CASINO TO COURT

Two gamblers in Pennsylvania have filed a federal lawsuit against the popular Sugar House Casino. The suit claims that the pair lost hundreds of thousands of dollars due to the venue's incorrect use of shuffling machines and "illegitimate" card decks. According to The Philadelphia Inquirer, the action was filed in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania and alleges breach of contract, unjust enrichment and negligence. The duo claims to have collectively lost in excess of \$250,000 over an eight-month period because of irregularities in equipment.

EARNINGS DOWN IN MACAU

According to published reports, the government of Macau has issued a warning detailing that the city's first-quarter gross domestic product had dropped by some 3.2% year-on-year in real terms, due in large part to a downturn in internal investment and tourist spending. According to a report citing official figures from the enclave's Statistics and Census Service, the results for three months concluded ten consecutive quarters of yearon-year GDP growth and showed that the comparative amount visiting gamblers had contributed to the local economy had shrunk



Parks and Bingo

Trail Day in Washington, Missouri, was another big hit for residents of that city, St. Clair, Union and other areas. The annual free event began fifteen years ago to provide seniors and the disabled with an opportunity to enjoy the city's parks and scenery. Held in part at the Washington Town & Country Fairgrounds' Swine Pavilion, the event included tractor-pulled tram rides with narrated tours of the roads and pathways along lake and riverfront parks. In addition to tram rides, guests enjoyed a large, ongoing game of Bingo in the Swine Pavilion. Bingo event volunteers also served up hot dogs, hamburgers, chips, cookies and drinks.

Electronic Bingo Ordinance Debated

The Monroe, Louisiana, City Council is considering an ordinance to amend the city code regarding the location of electronic video Bingo establishments. As the ordinance currently stands, such establishments are only allowed in locations specifically prescribed by zoning ordinances, and stipulates that video Bingo centers opened after May 1, 2008, cannot be located within a one-mile radius of any commercial lessor who has operating machines. Several Bingo parlor operators have addressed the council both for and against the measure.


Bingo Helps Youth Sports Programs

San Antonio Spurs basketball fans gave back and won big at this year's Silver & Black Give Back Go BinGO fundraiser at Jackpot Bingo in San Antonio, Texas. For \$50 admission, fans came to support the youth of San Antonio through Silver & Black Give Back (SBGB), while playing Bingo for major prizes like autographed Spurs memorabilia and one-of-akind experiences. Tickets to the sold-out event included one Bingo card for each game of the 12-round event, two drink tickets, a meal

voucher, and one ticket to a 2019 preseason Spurs home game. SBGB is a public charity that empowers youth through service and sports through programs like the Spurs Youth Basketball League, youth hockey and the SAFC Pro Academy.

Politician Criticized for Bingo Joke

Omaha, Nebraska's, Republican Rep. Don Bacon, a member of the House Armed Services Committee, took some heat recently for a Twitter post that made a joke about bombers and Iranian Bingo halls. Bacon said he was not trying to promote violence against civilians and called the criticism a "false controversy." The initial tweet was from Robert J. O'Neill, a former Navy SEAL sniper who says he fired the shot that killed terrorist Osama bin Laden. O'Neil tweeted: "Want to know how to clear out an Iranian Bingo parlor? B-52." Bacon, a retired brigadier general who said he knows O'Neill personally, replied from his personal Twitter account: "B-2 is even better." B-52s and B-2s are both bombers. Bacon said his tweet was meant lightheartedly and was a joke about how B-2s would be deployed to Iran rather than B-52s.



way, it is rare that a person can interpret her dreams by herself. To do so is like trying to see your own back, without the aid of a mirror. Most of the dream dictionary type books that you mention are from another time, a time when people relied more on superstitions to interpret dreams, a time when the unconscious mind was still in hiding, waiting to be "discovered."

If you were part of that airmobile crew that rescued Rich, thank you... and welcome home.

Please do your fellow Bingo players a good deed by passing along the suggestion that Bingo halls (some, not all) serving refreshments make a little more of an effort regarding the quality of the food they serve?

I understand that menus may be limited, but that doesn't mean that the soda cans have to be warm, the coffee must taste burnt or the hotdogs have to be shriveled and rubbery and served on buns it looks like someone sat on.

It completely changed our Bingo experience and my friends and I talked about the food the whole drive home. We have also added this Bingo to our list of regular games, completely because of that surprise menu.

This church has four new customers because of their kitchen. Other Bingo halls should think about doing something with their kitchens to help bring them more players, too. — Ellen T., Colorado, via email

Dear Ellen:

The Bingo hall kitchen is one of those great player inducements many game sponsors don't recognize or fully utilize.

Looking back, several of my all-time favorite Bingo experiences were memorable because some type of meal or food item was part of that experience. (And yes, I AM a foodie!)

One example was an Italian festival where there was an

amazing selection of Italian dishes to choose from and enjoy along with live music and other activities—including two Bingo sessions in a community hall.

A group of us went early, loaded up on meatballs and stuffed shells, and took our plates with us to eat during Bingo. My Bingo paper wound up a little saucy, but legible, and all in all it was a great, carb-loaded good time.

At another Bingo that I attended on a chilly fall afternoon, the kitchen offered several crockpots brimming with homemade soups and chili. It was a glorious, tummy-warming surprise and I made sure to sample every one of them.

Still another hall I attended while on vacation had a special table set up with a range of homemade baked goods and preserves you could buy and enjoy during Bingo or bag up and take home with you. I bought a caramel-apple dumpling to enjoy during Bingo and a loaf of cracked wheat bread (still warm enough that it steamed the inside of the plastic bag it was in) and a jar of apple-walnut preserves to take home. Heaven!

All these Bingo experiences took place 10 or more years ago but remain vivid in my mind because they were so amazing. I have plenty of others as well, all created by resourceful Bingo sponsors who had the vision to bring a little something extra to their games by way of the kitchen.

Please note, I have absolutely

The Color Purple

Dodson chose the Max-A-Million ticket because she thought it was pretty. "I liked the color purple," she said. Dodson and her husband have big plans for the money: They are paying off their mortgage, paying off a truck loan, and planning vacation trips to the Grand Canyon and Alaska.

Lotto Win 30 Years in the Making

A Michigan man who has stuck to the same lottery-playing routine for the past 30 years finally won a \$167,407 jackpot. "I have been buying a seven-draw Fantasy 5 ticket at the same store every Monday for 30 years," said the lucky player, who chose to remain anonymous. "When I checked the numbers the morning after the drawing and saw they matched

the numbers on my ticket, I was elated." The 58-year-old player bought his winning ticket at a party store in Royal Oak. He plans to complete some home renovations and save the remainder.

NY Lotto Reaches \$10 Billion

New York's lottery and video lottery gaming operations has become the first in the nation to top the \$10 billion mark in combined sales and earnings after winners are paid. The system recorded \$8.2 billion in sales for the state fiscal year that ended March 31, 2019, which included sales from Powerball, Jackpot, Mega Millions, Scratch Off, Quick Draw and other games, plus revenues generated by the state's licensed video lottery locations. The video lottery net win for the 2018-2019 fiscal year was \$2.08 billion. The combined sales and net win earnings for the last fiscal year are a new record for the New York Lottery. The New York Lottery generated \$3.47 billion in aid designated to support the state's schools. That's \$102 million more than in 2017-2018 and is also a new record.

I called Norma and found out that the Bingo cards she uses came from a supplier called S-and-S. It's a huge company in Connecticut that specializes in all aspects of Bingo.

A check of its Website (and of other Bingo suppliers) will show that large-print Bingo equipment is readily available. So, if you want to have your own Bingo games, but fear that many in your group will have problems with conventional Bingo cards or sheets, consider using large-print Bingo cards and equipment.

And, I am not the only one who thinks that Bingo can be good therapy. Over the years there have been numerous studies that have shown that playing Bingo is good for hand-eye coordination. Happy Help for Sad Sally

My in-laws are coming for a visit this summer. Can you suggest a recipe with pork? I want to impress them. Last time they were here I don't think they thought I was a very good hostess. Please help me. Also, do you have any suggestions for the rest of the meal? — Sad Sally from Hendersonville, NC

Dear Sad Sally,

I don't want you to be sad anymore. This recipe for roast pork is a winner. I would suggest corn on the cob, a green vegetable, baked sweet potatoes, and a salad. End the meal with fresh fruit or ice cream. Good luck. — **Annie**

ROAST PORK

- 1 leg pork, 8-10 pounds
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 tablespoon black pepper 1 quart canned tomatoes
- 3 sliced onions
- 1 tablespoon hot sauce
- 1 cup tomato catsup
- 1 cup water

Rub into the pork the brown sugar, salt and black pepper. Add to the pan for basting: the tomatoes, onions, hot sauce, catsup and water. Roast slowly about 3 ½ hours in a 350-degree oven (30 minutes per pound) in a roasting pan. Serves 8 to 10.



To Split, or Not to Split

Always split aces and eights. That is one of the golden rules for blackjack players, but not according to a friend of mine. He insists that splitting eights against a dealer up card of 9, 10, or ace is crazy because you are probably going to lose anyway, so why double your loss by splitting? Although my friend's logic appears to make sense it is flawed. Here's why.

When you split in blackjack, you must bet more. That is a fact. The strategy of pair splitting, then, only makes sense if you end up either winning more or losing less in the long run vs. standing or hitting.

Losing less is often a hard concept for blackjack players to grasp. For example, you can expect to be dealt a 12 through 17 hand about 43% of the time you play blackjack. No matter what strategy you follow, the dealer will, on average, win more hands than the player will (with only one

exception: a 17 vs. a dealer's up card of 6). Thus the best a player can do in a losing situation is to use a strategy that will allow him to lose less in the long haul.

This is, in fact, the situation with a pair of eights against a dealer 9, 10, or ace. If you hit the eights (or 16), you will lose on average about \$52 for every \$100 bet. That is quite a hefty loss, but not to be expected because you are a big underdog when you hold a 16 against a dealer's strong up card of 9, 10 or ace. However when you pair split, you break up your 16, double your bet, and play two hands of 8. A computer analysis of this situation shows you will lose about \$43 per \$100 bet when you split 8's. This is still a losing proposition from the player's perspective. But, notice by splitting you've won just enough split hands to reduce your overall loss \$9 per hundred dollars wagered. In other words, you are better off playing two hands starting with a count of 8 on each than playing one hand of 16.

To be sure, sometimes when you split a pair of 8's against say a dealer 10 you will lose both split hands. You might even hear some comments from the dealer or fellow players about why you should have stood or hit. Forget about them. Just remember that in the long run, which means after you are dealt many pairs of 8's against that dreaded 9, 10, or ace you will wind up losing less than if you stood or hit. Follow the basic strategy and always split 8's no matter what the dealer shows.

Thankfully my friend always splits aces. You would think that every blackjack player would automatically split aces. But recently I observed a young player pass on splitting aces because

"she was afraid to bet more on the hand." I even offered to make the bet for her at no risk (if the bet lost she owed me nothing). But it was like talking to a wall. She insisted on hitting the pair of aces and drew two tens and broke. She was mumbling incoherently when she left the table, knowing full well that if she had taken my offer she would have had two hands of 21 (by the way, I was card counting and the count was positive, indicating she had a good chance of drawing tens to her aces.)

It used to be standard casino policy that when you split aces you would get one and only one draw card to each split ace. Sometimes the player would draw another ace and was stuck with a hand of 12. Nowadays many casinos allow players the opportunity to re-split aces. In the above example the player could have split her third ace and played three hands. Re-splitting aces is a favorable player rule that adds about 0.06% in the player's favor. It doesn't look like much of an edge, but every bit helps so always re-split aces!

Follow the golden rule and always split eights and aces no matter what the dealer up card happens to be. Splitting aces will result in significant gains for the player. Splitting 8's for the most part is a defensive play that will cut down on your losses. But keep in mind you will lose your fair share of hands when you split 8's, but if you were to hit or stand, you would on average be losing more money. It's the smart play to make when you play blackjack.

Poker Talk



Snyder Endures an Epic Bad Beat in Reno

Bad beats. They happen in poker all the time. If you play often enough, no doubt you've experienced bad beats and put some on other players yourself.

As you probably know, there are two different types of bad beats. The first are those you see frequently, such as getting it in with a big pocket pair only to watch a smaller pocket pair flop a set. Those beats hurt, but they aren't all that uncommon.

On the flip side, there are bad beats that are so rare, so gutwrenching, that sometimes poker rooms try to alleviate the pain by awarding thousands of dollars via a bad beat jackpot. We're talking about hands involving quads, straight flushes and, of course, the granddaddy of all hands, the royal flush.

One such hand took place in the \$235 Black Chip Bounty tournament at Run It Up Reno VIII, an event held in April at the Peppermill resort and casino in Reno, Nevada. The tournament featured a \$100 bounty on each player.

Andrew Neeme, a popular American vlogger, was playing at the live-streamed feature table when his opponent, John Snyder, raised holding 5c 5h. Neeme, sitting on a stack of 34,600, looked down at 9c 9s and just called. Jan Shaw then threebet all in for 6,200 holding Ac Qc in the small blind. Snyder, who had 26,700 in his stack, called. Neeme did the same.

"I think once the original raiser (flat calls), it's pretty rare he's going to have that big of a hand or trap," Neeme said of the hand. "I think I should just isolate. Nines are a little bit vulnerable, obviously, to a lot of overcards. I think jamming makes a lot of sense, but as a cash game player not knowing what the hell to do in so many tournament spots, I just call."

The 9h 5s 9d was gin for Neeme, who flopped quads. Snyder, who flopped a full house, checked over to Neeme, who slow-played by checking behind. The 5d turn improved Snyder to a losing quad fives, and it was only a matter of time before the chips went in.

"When he turned it over, I immediately said, 'Oh my god,'" Neeme explained. "It's always a shock to see such a strong hand like that. I've never had, like, quads versus a straight flush or anything like that."

Being the beneficiary of quads over quads is so rare that most players haven't experienced it. For Neeme, it was actually his second time. The other instance came in a \$3-\$6 limit hold 'em cash game a few years ago. While many poker rooms offer bad beat jackpots for cash games, this one did not, meaning Neeme missed out on a big payday and had to settle for whatever was in that pot.

Likewise, in the Run It Up Reno tournament, there was no bad beat jackpot remedy to ease the pain for a shell-shocked Synder. Instead, all he was left with was a story about a hand he'll never forget.

According to published reports the American Gaming Association, in its latest "State of the States" report, noted that Nevada casinos did not enjoy a record year in calendar 2018. Nationally, gaming venues in many other states did. It was the fourth consecutive year that revenues increased, but last year seven states—New Jersey, Delaware, Mississippi, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and West Virginialaunched legal sports betting for the first time. The new jurisdictions boosted sports betting revenues 65% over 2017 to \$430.2 million.







How to Protect Yourself from the Social Security **Imposter Scam**

Dear Savvy Senior,

I recently received a strange call from a Social Security employee. He told me my Social Security number had been suspended because it was involved in a crime, and that I needed to reactivate it and secure my bank funds by withdrawing them and putting them on gift cards. Is this a scam? - Worried Rita

Dear Rita,

Yes. It's actually known as the "Social Security imposter scam" and it's becoming a widespread problem in the U.S. The Federal Trade Commission has received more than 76,000 reports about this growing scam in the past year alone. With average losses of \$1,500, this scam is quickly becoming one of fraudsters' favorite tricks.

The Social Security imposter

scam usually begins with a consumer receiving a call from someone claiming to be with the Social Security Administration. The caller informs the victim that their Social Security number (SSN) has been suspended because it was stolen or has been involved in

The phone call may be a robocaller with a message to "press 1" to speak with a fake support representative who then claims to be able to help reactivate the consumer's SSN.

In a variation on this scam, the caller may also reach out to tell a victim that they qualify for an increase in benefits. All they need to do is provide the scammer with some information. Typically, these callers will ask their victims several questions to get personal information that they can then use to steal their identity or drain their bank accounts.

Because of the numerous data breaches, these scammers may have access to accurate personal information —such as your SSN that they can use to build trust and appear legitimate. Regardless, before concluding the scam, fraudsters will almost always request payment to "unfreeze" the SSN or to process the increase in benefits. The scammer may request that they be paid via an unusual payment method such as by gift card (and giving the fraudster the gift card number), or some form of crypto currency like

While the scam can be devastating, there are several steps you can take to prevent vourself, and your loved ones, from falling victim to this scam:

• Don't trust your caller

ID: Scammers can make it look as if the Social Security Administration is calling and even use the agency's real number. If you receive an unexpected call from Social Security, don't answer it. Instead, call Social Security's customer service number at 800-772-1213 to see if they were actually trying to contact you.

- Remember, Social Security will never suspend your number or call and demand money: If anyone tells you something different, you're being scammed.
- Don't give out personal **information:** Never give out your Social Security number, bank information or other personal details to an unknown caller. If you already did, visit IdentityTheft. gov/SSA to find out what steps you can take to protect your credit and your identity.
- Don't trust the caller just because they may know some of vour personal information: It's most likely a scam if the person on the other end asks to confirm your information.
- Talk about the experience: Those who've been targeted should alert friends and neighbors about the call to spread information and report the scam to the FTC at FTC.gov/complaint.
