
**REF**: Police Services

Dear Township Board of Supervisors,

I am the chairman of the Board of Commissioners for the Southwestern Regional Police Department. The Board has asked me to invite Berwick Township to discuss whether there might be some mutual benefit in talking about offering our department's police services to you. This could be in three (3) different forms to include; combining services, or becoming a fellow member, or contracting police services with our department; all depending on what your current services and needs are. Please note that this letter of interest has been sent to other municipalities in our region; to those that we believe may have some interest in forming a new and proposed improved way of providing our residents with police services.

As a matter of reference, there are several options that a municipality would have when deciding on their police services. The choices could include, "combining resources" which would include joining your current staff together with our staff. Another option would be to become a "full member" of the department where that municipality would have membership and voting privileges on the police board or, using a "contract method" for obtaining police service. This would be the most economical method of obtaining services. The number of hours received and the cost would generally be decided by the municipality.

Southwestern Regional currently provides police services to four municipalities: Spring Grove Borough, North Codorus Township, Heidelberg Township, and Manheim Township. We employ 14 police officers, including a full-time detective, a police chief and two sergeants who serve as shift supervisors. In addition we have two non-uniform employees to assist with administrative duties.



York County, Pennsylvania

Through our use of the regional concept of policing, our department provides the highest level of police services very cost effectively.

- Our officers work full time and get to know our communities well, so each municipality has the feel of having its own police force.
- Our department never sleeps and never goes on vacation. We provide coverage all day and all night, every day including every holiday.
- Our detective allows in-depth investigation of crimes and incidents while keeping a full shift of officers on the street.
- Our size allows officers to receive special training and to develop expertise. For example, one of our officers has served on the York County SWAT Negotiations team. Another is assigned to the York County Drug Task Force. Special training areas include detecting drivers who are operating vehicles under the influence of illicit drugs, several officers are experts in reconstructing crashes using laser technology, other officers are trained to use our on-road/off-road police motorcycle to assist with investigations off road, and a police firearms and defensive tactics instructor.
- The regional police force allows this depth and breadth of service to be provided very cost effectively. The cost to our residents is one of the lowest in the state.

We believe that collaboration with other municipalities will enhance the benefits offered by our department by enabling Berwick Township to receive the services offered by our highly trained officers, while using cost sharing to provide these services in a cost-effective manner.

If Berwick Township is interested in discussing a possible collaboration with the Southwestern Regional Police Department, please contact me.
