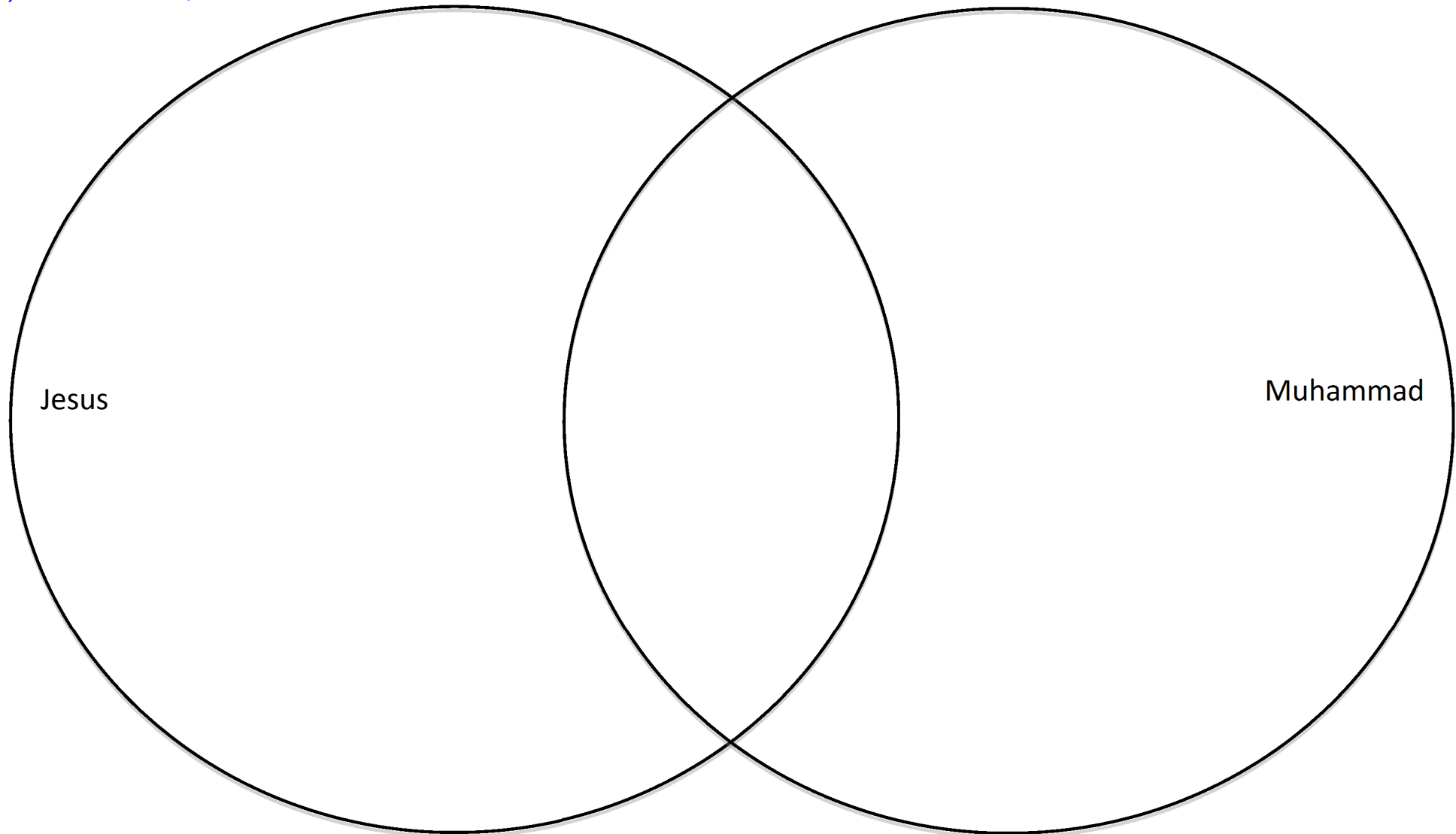

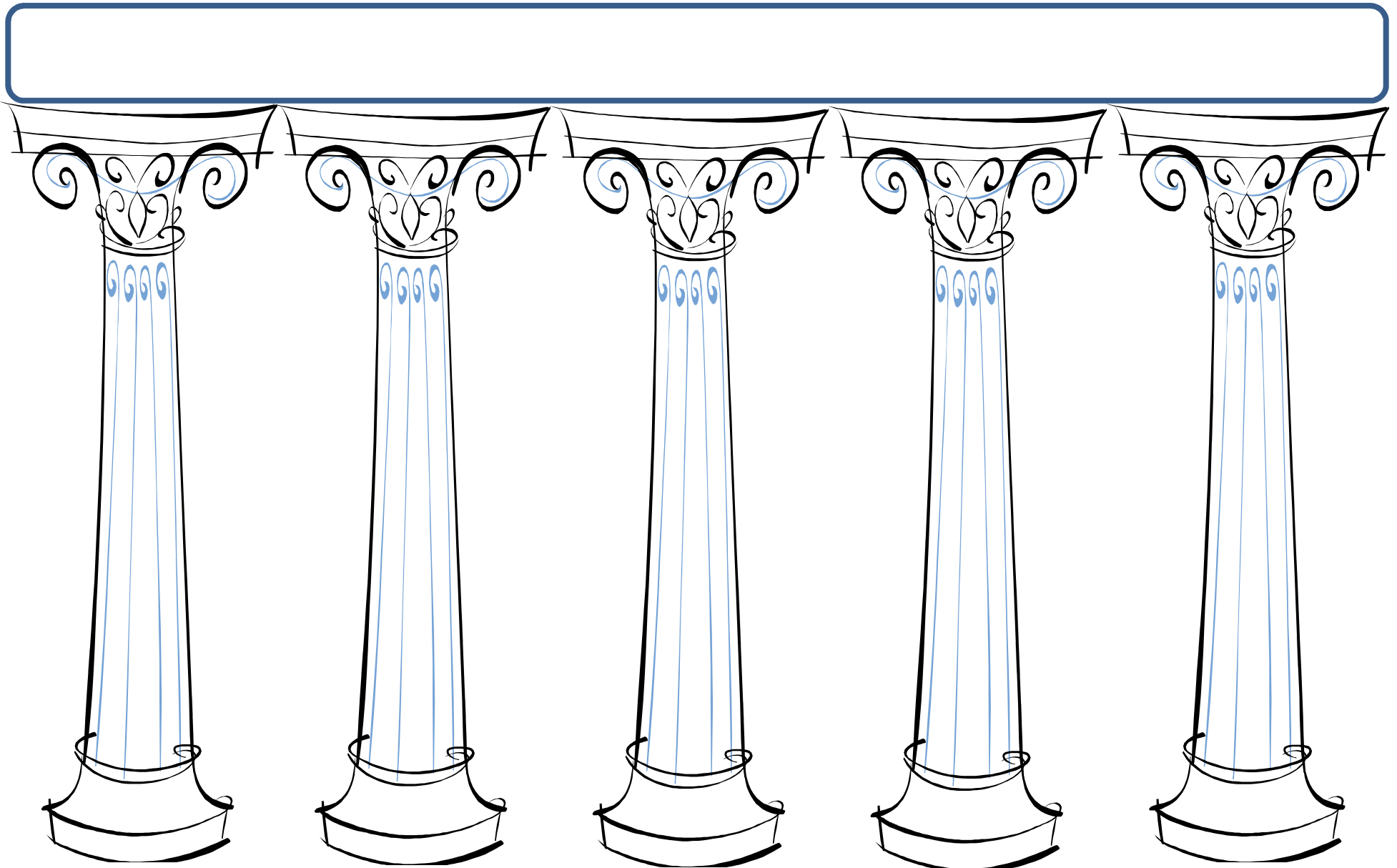
COMPARE and CONTRAST the lives of Jesus and Muhammad

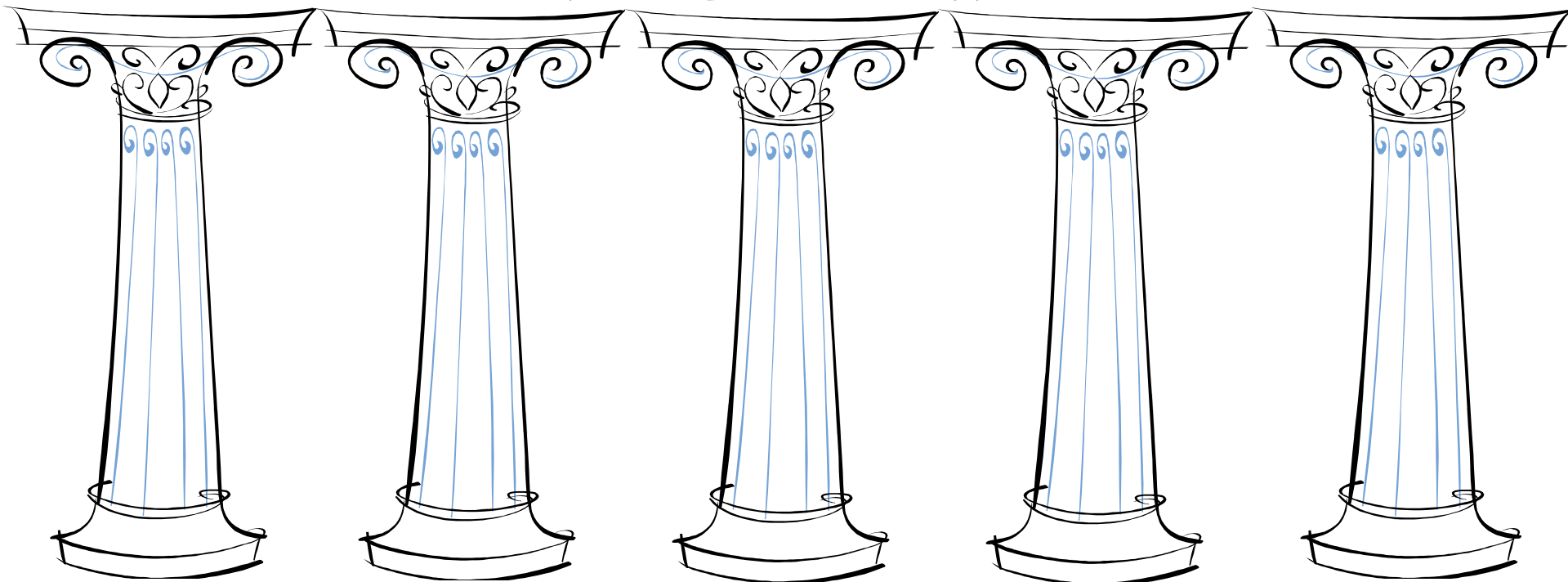

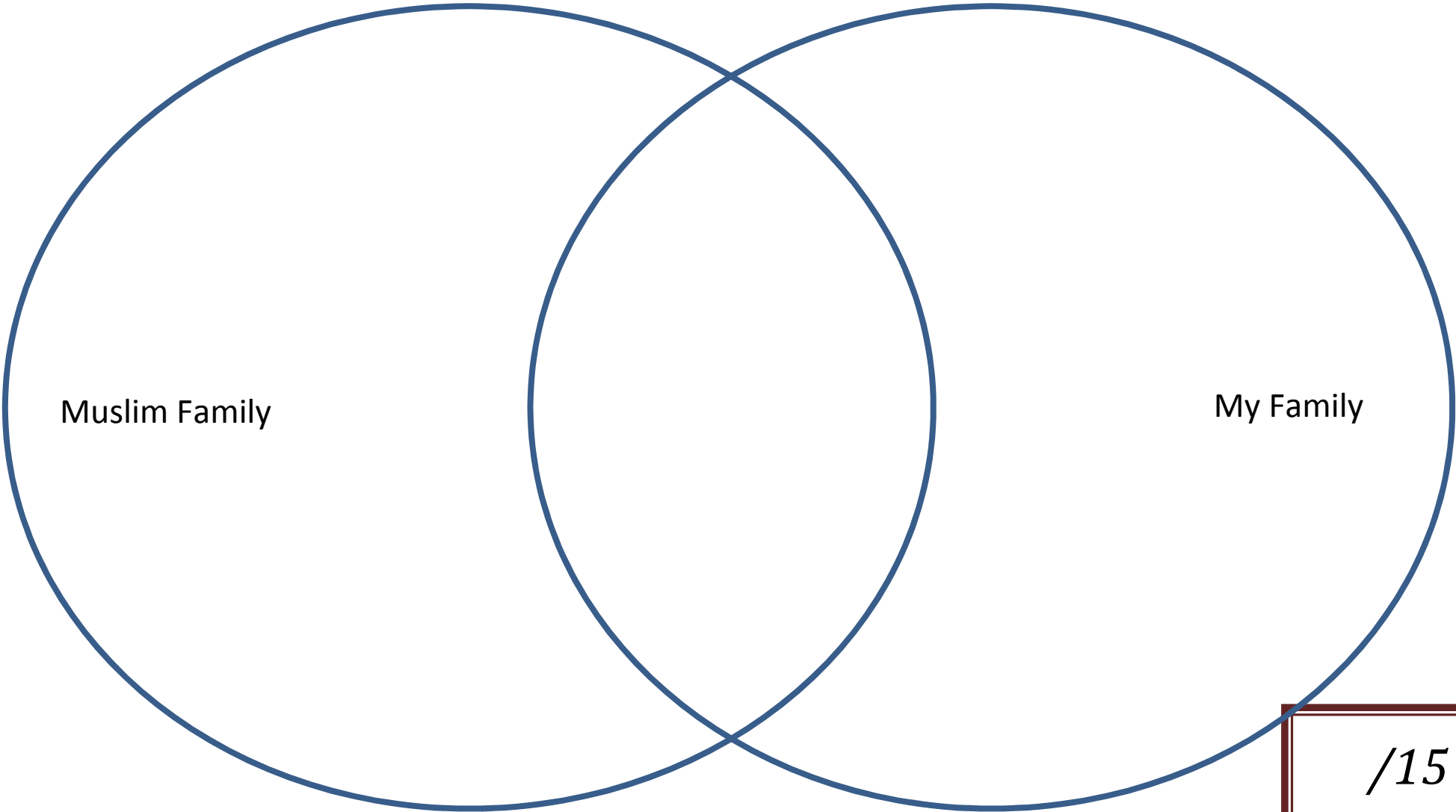
