OCTOBER MISSION AND OUTREACH

Last May, we collected money to be sent to Chogoria, to provide meals

for the students at the Mpangua school. We realized that we never reported on that collection. We collected \$555, which has been sent to Chogoria through our Presbytery office. When changed into Kenyan dollars, that will buy a lot of food. Thank you!

During August, we collected money to be used to buy winter wear for the children at the Bdecan church on the Spirit Lake Reservation. We collected \$852, which has been sent to the appropriate account at Presbytery. Shopping for the clothing has begun; again, THANK YOU!

Our bins are filling up in the narthex for our September focus on PATH. We are collecting items to set up apartments for young people who are aging out of the foster care system. Items will be loaded for delivery after worship on October 6th, so you have until then to bring items. Or... Boots or Donna will be happy to take your money and shop for you!

By request from several members, our October focus will be Churches United for the Homeless. As you undoubtedly saw on the news, they faced a major shortfall a few weeks ago. While donations did cover that shortfall, they still have continuing expenses through the end of this year. An advantage to donating through the church, according to some members, they won't get your name and address to add to their mailing list. Community Presbyterian has been a member of Churches United for several years, and we have supported the shelter in various ways. This is a concrete way to step up and help those who have fallen through the cracks, especially with the recent crackdown on those living outside the shelter.



The study this year is Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation by Patricia K. Tull. In this study, we are reminded that we are called to care for neighbors and God's creation with all our hearts, with particular care for society's least powerful members who are disproportionately impacted by unjust systems. In God's first instructions to the nation of Israel we hear "you shall not pervert the justice due to the poor" (Exodus 23:6); in Moses' final speech at the promised land's border, he reiterated, "Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue" (Deuteronomy 16:20); and from Amos, the earliest recorded prophet, "Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an everflowing stream (Amos 5:24). Scripture reminds us that we are called to speak out to urge our society to act for just transitions in this fast-changing world.
