I decided to keep our members informed of the lengthy process involved and will attempt to do so on a monthly basis. It definitely slow but moving. The first step for me was a simple trip to the campus UCLA in Westwood for High a Resolution CT Scan. This is supposed to give the doctor explicit information on what damage is apparent in the lungs. It has been a couple of weeks since this procedure and I have not heard any news from the transplant team. Told you the process was slow. Stay tuned for the next monthly installment.

There are three others in the program: Jasper Stephens has been accepted as a candidate and is waiting for a donor organ. We will keep him in a good place and hope he gets the call soon. Nan Werley is also a candidate and has just this last week made a move to campus of Duke University Hospital to begin the last stages of being accepted into their program. We should know quite soon if she will getting new lungs; she will be a double lung recipient according to her transplant team. Buck has been recommended to the UCLA program by VA hospital currently treats him. He is just at the point in the process where he starts to send information and vital statistics to them. It is an extraordinary time we live in, that this kind of medical

treatment is available and is so successful for many patients.
