President's Message SEPTEMBER 2018

Have you done any summer reading? There surely are a lot of ways to excite us about books, ebooks, audio books and more. Our Monroe County Library's website (keyslibraries.org) has a link for "Books Librarians Love" and several Best Sellers lists. PBS has "the Great American Read", (pbs.org/the-great-American-read/books) and Oprah has her popular book club picks (www.oprah.com/app/book). We can also browse the new publications featured on our UUA bookstore website, "In Spirit". (Found at uua.bookstore.org).

I myself have enjoyed several books with spiritual themes this summer. One is Robert Wright's <u>Why</u> <u>Buddhism is True</u>. For children, I've previewed <u>Breathe and Be</u> (A Book of Mindful Poems) by Katie Coombs. Another summer read has been <u>Testimony</u>: <u>The Transformative Power of Unitarian</u> <u>Universalism</u>, Meg Riley , Editor. These engaging stories remind us of why having a UU community of faith matters. One essay tells of a gay man who with his partner, an atheist, attended All Souls Church Unitarian in Washington, DC for the first time. As they were making their exit after the service, one woman took the time to stop and offer a hug, and these words, "I'm so glad you're here, in our community. Welcome!" The author of that essay is today a UU minister, Rev. Manish Mishra-Marzetti. Another essay was contributed from prison by a man who used a Zen quote, "When the student is ready, the teacher will appear." By an inmate who introduced him to Unitarian Universalism and through the Church of the Larger Fellowship, he began a new spiritual path.

Another author tells of growing up with one parent who was Southern Baptist, and another Muslim. As a teenager she decided to try a nearby UU church in Bellevue, WA. When greeted at the door, she was asked what she was looking for. Her response, "Well, I'm kind of Muslim, kind of Atheist, and really confused, so. I guess I don't really know what I'm looking for." To her complete surprise, she says, the greeter put her arm around her, smiled, led her into the sanctuary, and said, "I think this is just the place for you."
