#### St. Casimir's to Adopt Contemporary Rite Mass Liturgy

A new altar is being built to be used for the celebration of a Contemporary Rte Mass at St. Casimir's.

Fr. Tenus made the announcement at Mass recently and then demonstrated using a cardboard replica (that he made himself) of the proposed new altar that will be placed in front of the current altar and allow him to celebrate Mass facing the people.

The Mass of the Polish National Catholic Church uses one of three liturgies: the Contemporary Rite, the Traditional Rite, and the Rite of Prime Bishop Hodur.

The Contemporary Rite Is the shortest of the Mass types and the most used in PNCC parishes. It is similar to the current Roman Rite Mass except some parts are from the other two. It was introduced to the faithful of the PNCC in the late 1950s, long before Roman Church did the same.

Fr. Tenus explains, "Following last year's Eastern Diocese Synod resolutions I would like to introduce Contemporary Mass to St. Casimir's Family. This will be another step forward in the faith for all of us."

Initially, plans are for the new liturgy to be used once a month, then one Sunday Contemporary, one Sunday Traditional. A special instruction booklet will be printed for the congregation.

"I am very excited and happy for that (continued on page 3)

The Mass on Sunday, February 10th was broadcast live over the internet using an application called *Livestream*. More than thirty email messages were sent in advance of the Sunday test presentation. Several replies were received from individuals who viewed the Mass on the internet.
