

Roy's Reflections

The War to End All Wars

"You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains." Matthew 24:6-8

June 28, 2020, marks the 101st anniversary of the signing of the Treaty of Versailles. It was an epilogue to the First World War, 'the war to end all wars'. The optimism of this expression obviously did not survive long.

Wars take many forms: rebellions, genocides, territorial disputes, etc. It seems that every time there is another battle in the Middle East, we hear the same questions, "Do you think this one is Armageddon?" "Is this the one that ends everything?" Many totally miss the point of the words of Jesus in Mathew 24. His disciples would be awaiting his return before the first century ended, but he said 'don't bother looking at wars and other disasters as a sign of the end of the world'.

War is an inevitable product of human greed and ambition. Of course, Satan would have many believe that Christianity is the cause of most wars and many today parrot this fallacy of twisted history. Behind the façade of philosophical and religious differences is the REAL cause of wars, as explained in the scriptures for the last 20 centuries: "You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God." James 4:2

Can we not at least look to Armageddon as 'the war to end all wars'? Armageddon is mentioned only once in scriptures, in Revelation 16:16. This gathering of the forces of evil was met not with a traditional battle scene, but a vision of the outpouring of God's judgement. In preparation for Armageddon, the only advice given to Christians is found in the preceding verse...Stay awake! (i.e. spiritually healthy and alert). Babylon, a symbol of the Roman Empire, became the deserving victim of this 'battle'.

I propose that 'the war to end all wars' will not resemble any war ever recorded. It will be an irrevocable act of our loving and just Father who uses the weapons of His choosing.

Meanwhile, our struggle is "...against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms". Eph. 6:12. A mighty fortress is our God.
