From the President's Desk

San Antonio's Fiesta begins its 10-day run at the end of March and what excitement it brings to our city. Our first event, Teen Queen Coronation, will be Sunday, February 27, at 3 PM in the McAllister Auditorium on the San Antonio College campus. We are so proud of our three young ladies who will represent the Woman's Club of San Antonio this year in all of the Fiesta activities. Our Queen Avery Walker, our Princess Gabriella Geppert, and our Duchess Sarah Stone will be officially crowned by King Antonio, El Rey Feo, and the Fiesta Commission president. The Coronation theme is "Celebrating the Children of Fiesta," with 41 children participating in the event. A huge thank you to Coronation co-chairmen Madi Spengler and Michele Moad-Hageman for an exceptional display of beauty and pageantry for this year's Court. Many thanks to Johanna Christiansen and her team for arranging the reception at the Woodward Mansion following Coronation. These events are free and guests are welcome. The Auditorium is large enough to ensure social distancing for guest groups.





In March we also celebrate Women's History Month when we reflect on the often-overlooked contributions of women to United States history. One of the amazing contributors to San Antonio and Texas history is our founder, Eleanor Brackenridge, who dedicated her life to fighting for women's rights. She was able to get women into positions that were always held by men. She believed that Woman's Clubs should have a purpose. She started the PTA, helped established the College of Industrial Arts (now Texas Woman's University), and lobbied to give women the right to vote. Eleanor was the first woman in Bexar County to register to vote. She was born 185 years ago on March 7th. Two decades after her passing, Texas Governor Lee O'Daniel issued a proclamation that Friendship Day would be celebrated on her birthday for all Federated Clubs.

This year during Women's History Month, KLRN will be doing a program on Eleanor and I will be interviewed concerning her founding of our Club. On International Women's Day, **Tuesday, March 8th between 2 and 4 PM we will honor Eleanor with our 2022 Friendship Tea at the Mansion.** Our Friendship Round Table led by Patricia Broyles has been working diligently to honor Eleanor at this annual tea. The event is free and you may bring a guest but please RSVP so the Round Table will know how much food to prepare. Details are on page 4 of this newsletter.




