## Wascher inducted into Illinois High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame

Congratulations to Mark Wascher who recently became a member of the Illinois High School Baseball Coaches Association (IHSBCA) Hall of Fame!

Coach Mark "Sparky" Wascher grew up in Stewardson, Illinois. He

played baseball at Stewardson-Strasburg High School and was coached by Ken Knop and afterwards became Captain of the original baseball team of Lake Land College in 1969

under Laker Coach Gene Creek. Both Coaches Knop and Creek would later be inducted into the IHSBCA Hall of Fame (1979 and 1994).

Wascher is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University with a Master's Degree in Education-Majoring in Business Education and holding a

Minor Degree in Physical Education. He first taught and coached baseball for five vears at Auburn High School (Record 43-43-1) before moving back to his hometown (Stewardson) where he coached the Comets for thirty-two years (Record 718-431-8). His overall high school coaching record was 761-474-9 with seven National Trail Conference titles, seven Regional Mark and Bev Wascher



titles and a Third Place Finish in the 1996 IHSA Class A State Tournament-which earned him the Decatur Herald and Review Coach of the Year Award.

Coach Wascher was the Eastern Illinois Representative for the IHSBCA, Secretary of the National Trail Conference, and a registered IHSA Baseball and Basketball Official. He coached around 200 young men during the 37 years of his high school coaching career. Around 50 students went on to further their baseball careers in college. Five players he coached (one in little league) later signed professional baseball contracts. Those players are Brian Rothrock, Frank Brandt, Ryan Cox, Phil Wetherell and Clayton Brandt.

At the time of his teaching and coaching retirement in 2011, Coach Wascher was one of only three coaches at Stewardson-Strasburg High School (John T.

Middlesworth, 1950-61; Ken Knop, 1961-79; Mark Wascher, 1979-2011). Coach Wascher and his wife, Bev, live <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-block from where he grew up in Stewardson. He continues to be active in baseball as the "Commissioner" of the Stewardson Lions Club Summer Baseball Program and the Stewardson-Strasburg Jr. High baseball coach.

The 43rd Annual IHSBCA Hall of Fame Awards Dinner was held February 12, at the Westin Hotel in Lombard, Ill. With no awards given out in 2021, there were eight inductees into the Hall of Fame for 2022. Coach Wascher was nominated for the award by Shane Smith, Athletic Director at Stew-Stras.


Wascher is proud of all the boys who went on to play in college and especially proud to have been able to coach his three sons, Nathaniel, Gabe and Brendan.
