Luckily, the square dance club in Thousand Oaks, Buckles and Bows, is offering workshops from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. each Tuesday evening in July and Workshops are a fun August. way to continue to improve dancing skills over the summer months so that in September you will not need to review. 


