CAMP SERENITY: This camp on Lake Tomahawk happens in early August for children who have lost a parent in battle. Each year they ask for 80 quilts. I got 25 from Southport Quilters in Kenosha and 55 from Lighthouse, Rainbow and First Friday! THANK YOU EVERYONE!!!!

CRAYON CHALLENGE BAGS TAKEN BY 40 MEMBERS!

As of this newsletter, I am still waiting for 22 quilts I will be putting the 40 quilts on the black display drapes on August 2! Please honor the July 29 deadline!!!

The money from the Crayon Challenge will go to Bethany Apartments this year. Bethany has been in existence for more than 25 years and provides housing and supports for women and children who need longer term housing and who are moving out of situations in which they have been abused or exploited. Bethany provides job and education counseling and personal support for these women and their children. They can stay at Bethany in their own apartment for up to two years and will take their furniture and household goods with them when they are ready to leave.



Program: Friendship Quilts – Then and Now by Chris Lynn Kirsch

Craftakadabra – noun – when crafting supplies magically appear... in your closet, under the bed where you hid them years ago.

Chris showed a variety of vintage and more recent friendship quilts, some she collected from various sources, some she made or were given. Chris started her collection of friendship quilts in 2009 with an antique quilt she found in Lake Mills, WI. Many of her memory quilts are from trips she's made with other quilters. They each create signature blocks before the trip to trade with each other on the trip. When added with other blocks or mementos they make a great memory quilt. She coordinates travel for

quilters through her travel business Sew We Go https://www.chrisquilts.net/trips/. The next trip is to Tokyo in January to International Quilt Festival, and a November 2020 river boat cruise in Germany for the Christmas markets. To keep fabric stable when writing on it with pen (for signature), iron freezer paper to the back of the fabric, then peel it off when done, before quilting. Can also draw straight lines on the freezer paper to guide the writing on the fabric, then peel away and the lines are gone. **Business:**
