RENEW AND RECOVER

Matthew 4:1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

Each year the temptation of Jesus comes to our attention during the season of Lent. And each time it does, the question is raised, "Could Jesus have failed His test with temptation?"

I raise that question not as fodder for theological debate, but as a way of redirecting the significance of the temptation story away from Jesus' personal struggle as a man, and toward the personal struggles we as men and women of faith battle every day of our lives. The spiritual disciplines of Lent (prayer, fasting, and alms giving) were used by Jesus to defeat His demons, and they are designed to help us do the same.

It is vital that we incorporate Jesus' life, His teachings and ways of dealing with evil, as life lessons for our life in this world. As true man, Jesus knows your battles and is prepared and willing to fight them with you in whatever wilderness you may find yourself ensnared! Jesus is there for you!

Whatever temptation it is that threatens your life and/or your well-being, focus spiritual resources on it this Lent. Remember, Jesus has been there, Jesus knows how to lead you out of there, and Jesus joins you as a fellow participant in your journey toward recovery and redemption. In His word and by His example, Jesus offers you His wisdom, the power of faith in Him, and the very same Holy Spirit that aided Him in His battle with His demons.

Lent is a time for recovery and redemption; your recovery from sin, death and the power of the devil. Use the power of prayer, the conviction of your faith and the fellowship of believers to aid you as you begin a 40 day journey of spiritual renewal. To help in that endeavor, Trinity offers Wednesday evening worship services (7:00 p.m.) during this Lenten season.

Original: Section 10: 03 Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays and **by mail** to all members at least 10 days in advance of the date of that meeting.

Amendment to Section 10:03 Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays **by any means available** to all members at least 10 days in advance of the date of that meeting.

Original Section C10:04 *Fifty (50) voting members shall constitute a quorum.*

Amendment to Section C10:04 25% of the voting members shall constitute a quorum

Lenten Series and Adult Confirmation

I want to bring some clarification to the intent of our 2020 Lenten Midweek Adult Confirmation Series.

As you can see from the graphic above, another word for confirmation is the affirmation of baptism. Traditionally, the affirmation of baptism (confirmation) takes place at age 14 in our Lutheran church. But it also happens periodically throughout one's life, for example when one joins a new congregation.

When a person joins a congregation, they usually go through some orientation process. They are oriented by a general review of the basic teachings of the Lutheran Church, and specific traditions and characteristics of the local congregation. Following such an orientation, the new members are then asked to make public profession of their faith through what is called the affirmation of baptism. This act gives them confirmation status.

So whether you were confirmed as an 8th grader, or did it through the affirmation of baptism when you joined the congregation, you are confirmed.

This year's Midweek Lenten Series on the Large Catechism is an opportunity to review the teachings of the Lutheran Church for the already confirmed, and if you are not yet a member, nor ever were confirmed as a youth, an opportunity to accomplish that.

Here's a rule of thumb: baptism brings one into the Church of Christ. Once baptized always baptized. Confirmation brings one into a local congregation through the affirmation of baptism. which can/is done (potentially) many times.

Just as one is married only once (baptism), one can nonetheless renew the marriage vows (affirmation of baptism which is confirmation) many times.

I hope this brings clarification to what we mean when we say "confirmation" and what our church constitution requires to have the status and privilege of being a voting member.

Bible Studies



Tranfiguration Sunday

February 23, 2020

Our omnipresent God shows up in some unexpected places. People have "miraculously" seen Jesus' face on everything from junk food to a rusty water tank. We don't know what Jesus looked like, of course, but Scripture indicates his appearance was rather ordinary: "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him" (Isaiah 53:2, NIV).

On one occasion, however, Jesus' face was majestically transformed. At his Transfiguration, observed by many churches on the Sunday before Lent, Jesus' "face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light" (Matthew 17:2, ESV). Some disciples witnessed Jesus' glory — which will be ours, thanks to his death and resurrection. As 1 John 3:2 (NIV) promises: "When Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is."

African-American History Month

Racial reconciliation is a hot topic among Christians these days. In Sikeston, Missouri, which has a history of segregation, two church bodies recently decided to live out the gospel's message of unity by merging.

Kenny King, pastor of the mostly black Smith Chapel, and William Marshall, pastor of the mostly white Trinity Baptist, had become friends. They realized both churches, while healthy, were undergoing transitions, so they joined forces. The new congregation's name, Grace Bible Fellowship, represents God's grace and the grace we extend to others — no matter their skin color.

"We want to ... give people the benefit of the doubt instead of letting these issues divide us," King says. "The gospel of Jesus Christ has the power to keep us together and not keep us separated."
