

BETH SHALOM OF WHITTIER KRISTALLNACHT OBSERVANCE 2022

Beth Shalom of Whittier is excited to announce and host a special choral Saturday Morning Service that will take place on November 12, 2022, coinciding with Kristallnacht remembrances around the world. This will be an important event for the entire Jewish community of the San Gabriel Valley as

we have partnered with the Pestalozzistrasse Synagogue in Berlin, Germany for this special service of remembrance. The clergy there--Rabbi Jonah Sievers, Kantor Isidoro Abramowicz, and their organist/choir directors Regina Yantian and Dr. Jakub Stefek and professional choir have all helped in making this a reality for us. In fact, our Spiritual Leader, Hazzan Lance H Tapper, Hon. DMus. was in Berlin in early July to have a meeting with them in person to make sure the final aspects of this service were acquired. This service will feature the liturgy and music of services that takes place in the Berlin Jewish community.

The service will be officiated by Hazzan Tapper together with our Beth Shalom Professional Singers and our organist/choirmaster for this service, Alan Kelly Crawley. Most of the service will be in Hebrew and English, however, some of the liturgy will be recited or sung in German. This special service will take place in the sanctuary at our home at First Friends, 13205 Philadelphia St, Whittier, CA 90601 and will begin with a prelude at 9:25 am and the service proper beginning at 9:30 am.

And...as an added treat and incentive, a good friend and colleague of mine who is a retired Rabbi who was born in Berlin and whose father was a Rabbi for the Berlin Jewish community will be participating in the service as well.

Mezuzah

The Mezuzah is another taken from the Torah. It is the same paragraph as Tephillin. The last sentence of the paragraph is: "And you shall write them upon the doorposts of your house and upon your gates." What we learn from this is the following:

- 1. The belief in one G-d.
- 2. We love G-d with all our souls, heart and might.
- 3. That these words of G-d are upon our heart.
- 4. That we teach the words to our children.
- 5. That we discuss and speak of these words in our house, when we are traveling, when we awake, and when we go to bed.
- 6. That we put these words upon our arms and between our eyes. TEPHILLIN
- 7. That we write these words upon our doorposts and gates. MEZUZAH

A sofier, "scribe' writes this paragraph, which contains all the above laws on a piece of parchment. He uses the Torah script which is different from our regular script. This piece of parchment is rolled up and put in an oblong case which is then attached to the doorpost/gate. Thus we have fulfilled the commandment properly.

Laws of the "Mezuzah"

- 1. It is a commandment to put a "Mezuzah" upon every doorpost of every room except the bathroom. If a room has many doors, each door must have a "Mezuzah".
 - 2. If a court, a Jewish city or providence is surrounded by a gate, each gate must have a "Mezuzah".
- 3. The "Mezuzah" is put upon the right side of the entrance. It is put on the upper third of the doorpost. When we do this we recite a special blessing honoring the name of G-d, who has commanded us to put up the "Mezuzah" (This blessing is found in the "Siddur"). The "Mezuzah" should be put closer to the outside of the doorpost and slanted with the top pointed inward.
- 4. If they move from their home and they know that a Jew will be moving in after them, do not remove the "Mezuzah". You could leave it as a gift or ask the new tenant to buy it.
- 5. It is custom to touch the "Mezuzah" and kiss your hand when you enter and leave a home. In this way we can always be reminded of G-d and remember to follow His ways.

A person who follows the laws of the "Tephillin" and "Mezuzah" properly and with a perfect heart, can hardly sin, since they are constantly reminded of the right way of life. What a wonderful effect these laws could have upon the world, if everyone were to follow them. Think of it a world blessed with everlasting peace.


BOOK CLUB NEWS
