TONGUES OF FIRE

An interesting thing has happened around here in the past 2 months. And I can sum it up in 3 words- tongues of fire. Let me explain. In the New Testament Book of Acts, we get the story of the meteoric rise of the early Christian Church. And it all seems to REALLY start gaining traction on what we call The Day of Pentecost. If you remember that story, it's after the resurrection and ascension to heaven of Jesus. Many of His followers are more than a bit discouraged. They're not sure what to do next. And they are all gathered in a "large upper room" when suddenly God's Holy Spirit busts in and...well...all heck breaks loose!

There is a sound and feeling like a rushing wind. And in the midst of that, the Bible says that the Holy Spirit descends on each of the people gathered there "like tongues of fire". They are filled with the Spirit and immediately go out into the streets. It's right smack in the middle of Passover and the streets are PACKED with people from all over, speaking in a WIDE variety of native languages. But the Spirit enables the disciples to be understood in whatever language the hearer speaks. And those "tongues of fire" ignite what becomes an unquenchable, raging inferno that still burns today.

A fire was CLEARLY already burning here. But it seems that, since the news of my Stage 4 Anaplastic Thyroid Cancer diagnosis came out, the existing fire has become that unquenchable, raging inferno the early Church experienced. More and more people seem more and more on fire. Baptisms. New members. People stepping into leadership positions that have never done that before. New prayer groups cropping up left and right. And worship attendance? Oh my! July broke worship attendance records. We averaged just shy of 300 people/week in worship for the month. 300! In July! Not only is that amazing, it's actually HIGHER than the weekly average we carried INTO the month. Trust me- that SELDOM happens! In addition, views of the Live Facebook video of each week's sermon continue to rise. As I write this, the Week 2 video of The World As Best I Remember It has already been viewed 1,500 times! We were averaging 200/week before all of this!

What this all tells me is that you all are ON FIRE! You are inviting people. You are sharing with people. You are encouraging people to watch the sermon video or check out the church website. And THAT'S how a church REALLY grows. What we've done over the past few years has been greatgrowth by addition. You know- 1 here, 1 there. But what is happening NOW is growth by multiplication- exponential growth. Book of Acts growth. And THAT'S what we are called to do, because 'we exist to connect people to Jesus Christ".

I am greatly touched that my cancer diagnosis seems to be the outward catalyst for this. But I think it's just a "symptom". I think we as a congregation have been building, growing and preparing, waiting for just such a time as this. And...here it is! So, here's my request/prayer- don't let it end! We have been given a gift that few churches ever get to experience. That means God has trusted us with more because He felt we were being faithful with what we already had. This is NOT about me- it's about US and, more importantly, God. Keep the fire burning! God is good, all the time!



C.I.A. (CARING INDIVIDUAL ADULTS) LUNCHEON- SUMMER VACATION




