Minister's Advent Reflection

God has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. and has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; God has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

Luke 1: 51-53

This week, I was making arrangements for my cousin, Chris MacRae (the new Vocal Lecturer at the U of R) to sing during a few Advent Sunday services. One of the weeks, the reading is from Luke 1, where Mary and Elizabeth who are both expecting meet. Mary then sings or prays the Magnificat, Mary's song (except above). I thought this would be a good week to have a solo. Chris did have a piece from Bach's Magnificat but commented that it may be a bit harsh for Advent. I responded to him: 'Believe it or not Advent can be harsh! There is a lot of challenging messages in the Advent passages that call us to live differently and be more just!' Over the next few weeks we will hear Jesus talking about fear and foreboding before the Kingdom of God comes, and to be alert; we will hear John the Baptist offering warnings regarding repentance and of the wrath to come; and Mary's song which challenges the systems and structures that favour the rich and powerful. So, Advent *can* be harsh!

Within all of this harshness are the messages of Advent of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, as we wait for the celebration of the Christ Child breaking into our lives and into the

world. In the harshness we hear about and experience in our world and in our lives God's message of a new king, a new *kind* of king coming into the world of injustice brings hope to our lives. We celebrate the faith that Mary and Joseph showed on their journey, the message of hope proclaimed to the lowly shepherds, and honour that wise ones from diverse backgrounds came to pay homage to this little child. As we look toward this Christmas we celebrate, knowing the love that Jesus lived, and the hope and joy and peace he continues to offer us this season and every day of our lives! This Advent season, in the midst of its harshness, may you find messages of comfort and joy as we prepare for these celebrations.

May you have a blessed and wonderful Christmas season as well!

In-Person Worship Details

- If you are planning to attend in-person services:
 - Beginning Nov. 28, proof of vaccination must be provided by in-person service attendees.
 - We are required to wear masks and practice social distancing at the LSC.
 - We hope these implementations will make our services more accessible to those who are ineligible to receive a vaccine (immuno-compromised, children under 12, etc.). Those who are ineligible may attend without being vaccinated.
 - Please do not attend in-person services if you are experiencing any COVID-like symptoms, or have possibly been in contact with someone who has COVID.
- Please notify our office if you have tested positive for COVID-19 and have attended our in-person services within the last two weeks of your positive result.
- If you are not yet vaccinated, we invite you to join us online via Zoom or Facebook Live.
- Please let us know if you would be able to assist as a volunteer on Sundays as we will need help with ensuring that pandemic protocols are followed.



Please note that as of November 28, those who attend our worship services in-person will be asked to provide their proof of vaccination. This decision was made by Eastside's Leadership Team following a recommendation made by Dr. Saqib Shahab, Saskatchewan's Chief Medical Health Officer that places of worship should be requiring proof of vaccination. This decision was also made based on our commitment to create a safer space for our community during the pandemic. With these decisions and changes, we continue to invite those who are not vaccinated to join us online for hybrid worship on Zoom. If you need assistance with proof of vaccination, please notify our office. We continue to monitor the pandemic, and thank Eastsiders for helping us maintain pandemic safety protocols.
