Corvettes of Durham Cruise Etiquette

Once again we present some of the rules of etiquette and tips that are practiced for all cruises and outings:

- 1. Bring a walkie talkie with you if you have one.
- 2. Always start with a full tank of gas.
- 3. Attend 'drivers meeting' immediately prior to starting cruise. You will get information on which walkie talkie channel to use as well detailed info (and possibly a map) for the cruise.
- 4. Keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front without leaving large gaps.
- 5. Be mindful of your driving so that you are not kicking back stones/gravel, etc.
- No passing of other Vettes.
- 7. Keep the car behind you in sight at all times. If the car behind you gets caught at a red light or stop sign or if you can no longer see the car behind, pull over so that we can regroup when possible. The exception to this may be when travelling through a city with a lot of stop lights/signs. In this case, refer to your map, proceed on and regroup when convenient and safe to do so.
- 8. If the car behind you pulls over to the side of the road, you should also pull over as a sign to those ahead of you that there is a problem.
- 9. When stopping, do not stop on the road pull to side for safety.
- 10. When changing lanes or pulling back onto the road, the rear car should pull out to 'block' so that everyone ahead can get back onto the road easier.
- 11. If possible have the cell phone number of the cruise organizer so that if need be, you can contact them. You might also want to provide your cell number to them prior to starting the cruise.

The above are suggestions to help make cruising less stressful and safer for everyone, however it is most important to keep the 'rules of the road' in mind at all times.


Hopefully you remembered to pre-register before August 3 to take advantage of the \$15.00 savings.





Our favourite race team has been quite busy in the past month racing hard and trying to get on podium. Here is a brief look:

Prior to the opening day of the Mobil 1 Sportscar Grand Prix held at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park, the track hosted RaceFest at the Bowmanville Canadian Tire store.



This is a new venue for RaceFest. For a number of years, this was held at mid-day in downtown Toronto but with city and highway traffic and parking hassles, RaceFest was now in the 'back yard' of CTMP. On hand on that Wednesday evening were displays by Mobil 1 and Inside Track (magazine) and some of the drivers and race cars from the WeatherTech and SCCA US F series. The No. 4 Corvette, crew chief Dan Binks and several of

area of the

inside that area, Ron drove the No. 4 from a standing position at high speed to a designated point where the crew, smoothly and efficiently (most times!!), raised the car and proceeded to change all four tires at the same time. Each tire change timing was meant to be quicker than the previous and after a series of drive-and-change, their best time was 9.948 seconds! In between sessions, spectators could chat with Ron and were invited to sit in the No. 4 Corvette. This was a big hit with the children and adults too! Thanks to those COD members who were able to attend. We hope next year to receive more advance notice of this fun event!

As mentioned above, CTMP hosted the Mobil 1 Sportscar Grand Prix on July 6 - 9 where the No. 3 team of Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen retained their Driver's Championship lead in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's GTLM class with a 4th place finish. Chevrolet also maintained their lead in the Manufacturer's Championship. Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner driving the No. 4 Corvette ended in 8th place

after being involved in a heavy crash late the race. Milner went hard into the outside tires but walked away uninjured; he was evaluated and released from the infield medical center shortly after. A heavy shower on the back part of the track had left it damp before the No. 4 Corvette's incident. (For a YouTube video of this incident, see the July 9th edition of CorvetteBlogger.com.) Another downpour with just five minutes to go caused another accident for a prototype car and the third full-course caution of the day. The race ended under yellow.
