Painesville City Council meets the first and third Mondays of the month at 7:30 p.m. at City Hall in Municipal Courtroom #1, Council Chambers.

Summer schedule in July and August are third Mondays only. In the event of holiday, the meeting moves to next day.

\*Note: City Manager reports and legislation are posted by 5:00 p.m. the Thursday before a council meeting. Agendas, minutes, adopted legislation and videos are available within 48 hours after a meeting.

Painesville City Council would like to thank former councilman Tom Fitzgerald for his years of service to the residents of Painesville. Mr. Fitzgerald did not run for re-election and we wish him best of luck in the next chapter of your life. Mr. Fitzgerald's seat has been filled by long-time resident Derrick Abney. Welcome Councilman Abney and congratulations Councilwoman Lori DiNallo on her re-election to another four-year term.

In addition to a new face on Council, City Council voted on their new president and vice president, which occurs every two years. Past President Paul Hach stepped aside and Councilwoman Christine Shoop was become the new Council President and I have become Vice President. Thank you to my fellow councilmembers for their vote of confidence and congratulation to President Shoop.

The year 2022 will again be an active year in Painesville City. There are several road projects on the drawing board for resurfacing including Chestnut Street, Newell Street and Reed Avenue. The Bank Street Retaining Wall project will also start in conjunction with the Army Corp of Engineers. In addition, the Various Roads Project of 2021 that was postponed will be completed which includes resurfacing a small section of N St. Clair Street and Elm Street, Sterling Ave, Paige Place, Nottingham Place and Stonehaven Drive. Also included in the 2022 budget is a new \$300,000 fire truck. Painesville City Council continues to follow the philosophy of trying to pay cash for projects and equipment while balancing the budget yearly.

And a final thought: over the past two years when you have gone out in public the theme has been wear a mask, stay 6 feet apart and wash your hands. As we head into 2022 we need to continue these behaviors and not only think of ourselves but also our community of Painesville.

#### PCFD: Winter Tips to Keep You Safe

Winter can be a particularly dangerous time of year when it comes to public health and safety. Here are some tips from the Painesville City Fire Department to make you winter ready:

Use space heaters with caution and keep heaters away from curtains, drapes and other objects within 3 feet of the unit. DO NOT use power strips or extension cords with electric heaters as they can melt and cause a fire. Make sure you have adequate ventilation if using a kerosene heater and never add fuel to a kerosene heater indoors. the correct fuel in your kerosene heater as gasoline can cause a violent explosion.

- If the power goes out and you choose to run a generator, DO NOT run a generator indoors in an enclosed area (like a garage, carport, etc). This can cause a buildup of exhaust and create a carbon monoxide hazard. Run your generator away from your home, where there is plenty of fresh air.
- Have a working carbon 3. monoxide detector in your home. Carbon monoxide is a silent killer

Also make sure you are using and anything that burns fuel can make carbon monoxide. This includes gas stoves, gas water heaters, gas or oil furnaces and fireplaces.

> 4. If you think you have Covid-19, and you are able, please meet our EMS personnel outside your home. This limits our exposure to your home and your family's exposure to our EMS personnel. We understand that often because of medical issues, you may not be able to come outside. Please let the 9-1-1 dispatcher know this and meet us outside only if you are able to.

#### Reminder to Keep Sidewalks & Fire Hydrants Clear

Residents and business owners plowing. are reminded that it is their responsibility to keep sidewalks and fire hydrants clear after snowfalls.

For snow falls under four inches, it is the property owner's responsibility to shovel any sidewalks, curbs or gutters abutting their property. For snow fall more than four inches, city crews plow sidewalks throughout city limits. Plowing begins at 12 midnight after a snow fall and typically takes 12 hours to complete. Sidewalks around schools are given first priority for

If your driveway is plowed, please remember to clear the snow mounds left behind on the sidewalks. Many children walk to bus stops and snow mounds block a clear and safe path.

Also remember to not run any kind of cords for holiday displays across your sidewalks, especially electrical cords. All displays, retaining walls, fencing, etc. should be at least two feet off the sidewalk (some brick and stone walls being an exception). Staking or posting your sidewalk edges is always helpful to our crews.

The area around fire hydrants should also be kept clear after heavy snowfall. Shovel around your hydrant to be ready if an emergency occurs.

#### Available Funding Still Painesville City Sidewalk Program

2018 City Council passed the Painesville City Sidewalk Program, a two phase infrastructure improvement plan aimed at improving walkability in the community. During Phase 1 (2018-ongoing), city staff replaced damaged sidewalk slabs that fell under city responsibility and removed any trees in the tree lawn that were deemed hazardous to sidewalks or infrastructure.

Phase 2 (2020-ongoing), has property owners replacing sidewalk slabs that fall under their

responsibility and any trees in the tree lawn that may be deemed hazardous to those sidewalks. As a result, the city applied for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) through the Lake County Commissioners Office and was awarded \$50,000 to fund the Disadvantaged Sidewalk Assistance Program for low to moderate income Painesville residents. There is currently \$27,500 left for those who need assistance.

## Bankruptcy 101






