My Planters Prayer: Lord Bless these seeds, for those it feeds, may our labor sustain our crops, until a bountiful harvest abounds.


Whatever activity you enjoy for your down time be grateful that in this country freedom is still alive by the grace of God. Enjoy your summer

History of the American Flag

Illuminating American History Through the American Flag

Seventh in a Series By Thomas Palchak



The image above is a forty-five-star American flag (1896-1908). This was the flag raised by Navy Rear Admiral Robert E. Peary on the North Pole on April 6, 1909. Robert Peary was born May 6, 1856, in Cresson, Pennsylvania.

Preparations for his exploration of the Artic regions began in October, 1904. The vessel was constructed at Bucksport, Maine. After the hull was completed, she was towed to Portland, where her machinery, steel plating, spars, and navigation equipment was installed. Peary's ship was christened *Roosevelt*. She sailed to New York, anchored in the North River where supplies were put aboard. On the 16th of July the Roosevelt, with the Stars and Stripes waving from the mizzentruck, sailed from New York towards the northern terminus of the Greenland ice sheet and beyond.

In 1898 Josephine Peary made a large, gold-fringed, taffeta, forty-five-star American flag for her husband as he was about to embark on a four-year expedition to the Artic.

On September 6, 1909, a telegraph crackled to life from the Smoky Tickle telegraph station at Indian harbor in Labrador. Peary telegraphed his wife, Josephine, at their summer home on Eagle Island in Casco Bay off the Main coast. The message was understated yet profound... "Have nailed the Stars and Stripes to the Pole."
