

### A MESSAGE FROM WALK #122 SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

#### Lessons from the Trail

Recently I fulfilled a lifelong dream by taking a two week vacation to New England. Those who know me probably aren't surprised that I spent a large portion of my time hiking in the mountains. It's just something I love to do. Over the years I've discovered that hiking is more than a way to blow off steam or to get into shape, but it's a wonderful way to grow in my relationship with God. I'd like to share a few spiritual insights that I've learned from the trail and that apply to all of us during our 4<sup>th</sup> days.

First, training is essential. Without adequate physical training, what should be an enjoyable hike can be torture. If you aren't in good shape physically, you not only don't enjoy the hike, but you can put yourself (and others) in grave danger. Spiritual training works the same way. There are some places you cannot go in your relationship with Christ without training. If you want God to show you the view from the top of the mountain, true spiritual exercise is essential. Of course, I'm referring to the regular spiritual disciplines like prayer, Bible reading, meditation, fasting, worship, and giving – you know the things we learn at Emmaus.

Second, there is no easy way to the top. It takes time. The reality is that if you're going to get to the summit, you have to pay your dues to get there. There are no shortcuts. There are no shortcuts in the spiritual life either. If we're going to see the high vistas in the spiritual life that God wants to show us, we have to be patient. Growth takes time.

Third, some views can only be seen on the way up the mountain. In the White Mountains of New Hampshire I saw some magnificent waterfalls along the trail. Some of the most spectacular views I saw before I even reached the summit. If God was only interested in us reaching the summit, don't you think He would just take us to heaven the moment we accepted Christ as our Lord and Savior? But some things can only be seen on the climb.

Fourth, the view from the top is better after making the climb to get there. In Acadia National Park in Maine, many people drive to the top of Cadillac Mountain to see the spectacular views. And they aren't disappointed. However, those who make the effort to hike and climb to the top appreciate the views in a different way. Do you see the spiritual lesson here?

Finally, from the top your perspective changes. On the way up, there are difficult stretches: boulders to climb over and rushing streams to cross. It's easy to lose sight of where we're going because all we can see is the difficult terrain. But from the top, what was difficult terrain actually becomes a part of the beauty of the view. In life, it's easy to become discouraged by the boulders and difficult terrain, but in the end it all contributes to the beauty of the vista.

No wonder David could say in Psalm 18:33 - "He makes my feet like the feet of a deer; he enables me to stand on the heights."

Anybody want to go hiking?
