Long ago there was a little baby born in Bethlehem of Judea. Many little boys and girls had been born in this city, but this little boy was special in many ways.

First, the Holy Scripture had prophisied his birth-Isaiah 7:14: Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel."

This scripture was fulfilled nearly two thousand years ago in Bethlehem. I can just hear the angel of the Lord as he talked to Mary, confirming what was going to come to pass: Luke 1:37--"For with God nothing shall be impossible."

Greetings In Jesus Christ

I am so thankful for the heritage left me by my sweet Godly grandmothers, the late Hattie Ostrander and Jessie Dibbens. Also by wonderful parents, the late Charles and Anna Mahan, who were a very Godly example, inspiration, honest and put God first in their lifes. They lived the Christian life before we four children. "What a blessing they were to us" and I know to many of you.

We all have had our valley and mountain top experiences in our Christian walk with the Lord. In speaking of my own experiences, He has always been a present help in everytime of need. "He said He would never leave me nor forsake me but go with me all the way". He definitely has proved that to me. I heard the statement made in fact Robert Schuller has written a book about it. "Life is not fair

but God is so good." He is a wonderful friend to me.

This past year (starting in May 1990) something inside of me started happening - things were very different than any other time in my life. One thing led to another and before long I started having all kind of health problems. My doctor put me in the hospital several times. While in the hospital I went into a very deep depression, which I had never experienced (just like this) before in my life. morning the doctor was going to release me to go home, I could not even walk. I was waiting him to come amd I wondered what happened to my legs, when he came in he sat down and started visiting with me. I will never forget that day as long as I live. He looked at me and said "Icannot let you go home like this", and he proceeded to tell me what his I argued with him but to no avail. Arrangements were made to have me transferred to a Ward on the 7th floor of St Joseph Hospital called "LIFE" Improvement for the Adult (Mature). My what an ordeal that was. Words cannot express my feelings while in that place. There were some patients getting shock treatments. All kinds of things happening which were scary. There were several semi-private rooms about 12 to 15 people as patients. I was in a private room.

The only door to this Ward was locked. We could not get out unless someone took us to Physical Therapy etc. My dear family, friends, Pastor Pruitt and Ruth could come in certain times to visit and pray with me. I could not relate or respond to anyone, not even to the ones closest to me, my family. I am so glad Jesus and they loved me so much that they looked beyond all that and saw my need. They kept praying and encouraging me. Praise the Lord!

Many People do not have anyone praying for them like I did when I could not pray for myself. I was in this place for a long month or more. Finally the day before I was to be released to go home, they had a conference with me, my sister and brothers, case workers, head nurse, and also the Health Administrator from where I live. This doctor was not my family doctor. He did not paint a very bright picture - it was dark and nothing in the natural to look to. I will never forget how I felt. Highlights of the talk was this, had some short term memory loss, the very deep depression, starting of Parkinsons disease, which would continue to grow worse until I would finally end up in a nursing home, could not drive

my car and would have to come back to his office for some time. That was not all of it - next day while a nurse was helping me get ready to leave, she proceeded to tell me I would be back there in a short time. Anyone as bad as I was could not function properly on the outside. I told her, "I would not be back, because the Lord was going to take care of me." We argued back and forth for quite awhile.

That day has been over a year ago and I never have been back to the hospital or to the doctors office. Praise the Lord. My own family doctor made arrangements for a Home Health Care Nurse to come out to see me every other day for a month or so. What a blessing Debbie was to me at that very

important time in my life.

I definitely was not a well person when I left the hospital, but over a period of several months the Lord performed two miracles in my life. He healed me completely from the very deep depression and there are no signs of Parkinsons disease O how wonderful the Lord is. My family doctor told me one day when I went to see him. He smiled and said, "I did not think you would ever come out of it but I am so glad you did." Then just a few weeks ago his wife, his assistant, told me when checking my blood pressure, "What has happened to you is definitely a miracle." Praise the Lord. What a thrill. I told them both that through prayer and faith in the Lord I was healed. Witnessed to them about my wonderful loving, caring, praying family of sisters, brothers, nieces, nephews and my Darling Great Ones. That is priceless. Money can not buy that. I am so thankful and grateful to the good Lord for what He has done for me.

I want to take this time here to thank the extended Mahan family, my church family, friends and relatives for all your prayers, phones call, many cards (one cousin and his wife Norman & Jeannie Dibbens sent me a card every week with encouraging words for months.) Some of you drove miles to come visit and pray, others drove many miles from out of town to be with me, giving me encouraging words and praying with me. May God Richly Bless each of you. Prayer is so important in our lives. I was raised on prayer.

My earliest recollection of the Lord answering prayer was when my two sisters (Dorcas Spicer & Naomi Busch) and I prayed along with Mother & Dad to give us a baby brother and son. He did on May 7, 1930. Paul came to live with a happy Mahan family. You know what, he has been someone very, very special to me all these years. A wonderful Christian man.

Prayer and faith work harmoniously together. Prayer is conscious of the need while faith supplies it. Prayer never obtains anything from God unless faith is present. Faith never received anything from God unless prayer makes a petition. Miracle is a supernatural occurrence produced by the Power of God. Praise the Lord!

I feel like Jesus Christ is coming soon and we all need to get our house in order as my Dad used to say when preaching. It is closer today than it was back there.

I am thankful to be a part of the family of God.

There is nothing romantic in having your first baby in a drafty cave because no one in the inn next door will give up a bed for you, and it isn't really much fun to put your baby to sleep in the cattle's feeding trough because there is nowhere else except the dirty floor.

The historic fact, shorn of its romance and decoration, was rather ugly and squalid. It is not a pleasant thing for a mother to feel that the world has no room for her baby.

How it must have cheered Mary when the rough shepherds came bursting in, all breathless and excited, saying they had had a vision of angels up there on the hillside and had been told that this little fellow was really God, and might they please kneel and give Him their presents! How the people snoring comfortably in the inn next door would have laughed at the sight of those country bumpkins kneeling on the stable floor. It would have been as good as a play!

Yet that is how God made His entrance. If you can once imagine the contrast between the splendors of heaven and the squalors of earth, you cannot help admiring and loving a character who accepted no special advantages or defenses, who lived life on the same terms as His creatures.

That is the real good cheer of Christmas: that God is not an aloof invisible power, but One who actually took the risk of entering this world.
