Mary's Humility

O Mary, humblest of all creatures, make me humble of heart. St. Bernard says: *"It is not hard to be humble in a hidden life, but to remain so in the midst of honors is a truly rare and beautiful virtue."* The Blessed Virgin was certainly the woman whom God honored most highly, whom He raised above all other creatures; yet no creature was so humble and lowly as she. A holy rivalry seemed to exist between Mary and God; the higher God elevated her, the lowlier she became in her humility. The Angel called her "full of grace," and Mary "was troubled" (Luke 1:28, 29). According to St. Alphonsus' explanation, *"Mary was troubled because she was filled with humility, disliked praise, and desired that God only be praised."* The Angel revealed to her the sublime mission which was to be entrusted to her by the Most High, and Mary declared herself "the handmaid of the Lord" (Luke 1:38). Her thoughts did not linger over the immense honor that would be hers as the woman chosen from all women to be the Mother of the Son of God; but, she contemplated in wonder the great mystery of a God who willed to become incarnate in the womb of a poor creature. If God wished to descend so far as to give Himself to her as a Son, to what depths should not His little handmaid abase herself? The more she understood the grandeur of the mystery, the immensity of the divine gift, the more she humbled herself, submerging herself in her nothingness. Her attitude was the same when Elizabeth greeted her, *"Blessed art thou among women"* (Luke 1:42). Those words did not astonish her, for she was already the Mother of God; yet she remained steadfast in her profound humility. She attributed everything to God whose mercies she sang, acknowledging the condescension with which He had *"regarded the humility of His handmaid"* (Luke 1:48). That God had performed great works in her she knew and acknowledged, but instead of boasting about them, she directed everything to His glory. Behold the effect that graces

and divine favors should produce in us: an increase of humility, a greater awareness of our nothingness.

"O Virgin! glorious stem, to what sublime height do you raise your corolla? Straight to Him who is seated on the throne, to the God of Majesty. I do not wonder since you are so deeply rooted in humility. Hail, Mary, full of grace! You are truly full of grace, for you are pleasing to God, to the angels, and to men: to men, by your maternity; to the angels, by your virginity; to God, by your humility. - St. Bernard

4 Titulos para la Virgen María

El título más antiguo para la Santísima Virgen María es simplemente el de "Madre." Era el nombre que Jesús uso y es el nombre que los cristianos han estado usando desde entonces. Ella es una madre espiritual que vela sobre nosotros y nos cuida en nuestras necesidades. Sin embargo, la Iglesia le ha dado una letanía de nombres. Aquí hay cuatro de tales títulos; al igual que una breve explicación, que ojala pueda derramar algo de luz a los otros nombres que son menos conocidos referente a la Virgen María.

Torre de David

Del Canto de Salomón, en donde Dios es visto como un amante el cual está describiendo la belleza de su amada. En él se lee, "Tu cuello es como la torre de David, construida para un arsenal..." (4:4). El título primero señala el aspecto del papel espiritual de María en la historia de la salvación. En segundo lugar, el Rey David construyo una torre en Jerusalén para proteger al pueblo de los asaltos del enemigo. La virgen María es una madre protectora y ella hará todo lo que sea necesario para defender a sus hijos espirituales. Ella es un lugar de refugio durante la guerra de nuestra alma.

Torre de Marfil

Tenemos otra torre pero esta es de "marfil." Nuevamente, este título aparece primero en el Canto de Salomón en un escenario similar. Dios habla nuevamente de su amada, "Tu cuello es como una torre de marfil." (7:4) El marfil es de color blanco y se relaciona con la identidad de María como la "Inmaculada Concepción." Este título nos recuerda la pureza de la Virgen María y nos urge a imitar su completa fidelidad a Dios.

Estrella de la Mañana

La estrella de la mañana es conocida como la última estrella en el cielo antes de que se levante el sol. El cardenal John Henry Newman explica, "es la prerrogativa de la estrella de la Mañana, la cual anuncia el sol. Ella no brilla por sí sola, o por ella misma, pero ella es la reflexión de ella y de nuestro Redentor, y ella lo glorifica a Él. Esto nos enseña que también nosotros somos llamados a ser heraldos de la luz de Cristo y siempre apuntar hacia el Sol que nunca se mete.

Destructora de Herejía

El Papa pio X invocaba a la Santísima Virgen María con el título de Destructora de las herejías. El tomo esta curiosa apelación de la gentil, dulce dama de Nazaret de la Misa de la Santísima Virgen María. El título tuvo un significado particular en contra del modernismo en 1911. Del libro de Génesis muchos han interpretado a María como la que predijo quien iba a aplastar la cabeza de la serpiente, el diablo, y puesto que las herejías vienen de la boca del mismísimo Satanás, María es vista como la que puede destruir las herejías.
