PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

Summer is beginning slowly due to the restrictions that are still in place for COVID 19. We

were allowed to open our pool however, for exercise only. It does not look promising to have our pool/patio area available this summer for social gatherings and sunbathing. Because the pool can only be used for exercise and not recreation, we have limited the use to residents only. I would like to thank Ron Yamato, Dale Lucas and the pool committee for getting the pool ready and keeping it maintained.

The board had a short meeting to discuss property liens and the current opening on our Board. The Board has agreed to choose the replacement since that is what is called for in the Bylaws. We have asked all of those that have expressed interest in this position to submit a short Bio and their reason for wanting to be on the board. We will conduct interviews of those that turn in their information on time and then select the replacement at some point in July.

One other reminder to all homeowners is our rules regarding front yard decorations. No decorations or statuary are allowed in the common area outside the front gates.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Sheltering-in-place precautions are still having a positive effect on our bottom line. We are below budget in most expense categories except for General and Administrative because of our insurance premium. We paid the HOA liability and bond insurance premium up front for the entire year, but as the year progresses this expense is gradually leveling out. Up through May we are about \$15,400 under budget. Our operating cash stood at about \$77,000. After deducting current liabilities of about \$10,900, we had a liquid cash position of about \$66,000. which should be sufficient to cover any surprise in the next few months. We are experiencing an increase of

delinquent accounts, however, with seven homeowners being \$7,089.50 in arrears. We are asking these homeowners to contact Strong Management to either pay their delinquent dues or work out some kind of payback arrangement.

FIRE PREVENTION

It seems fire season starts earlier each year. From CalFire, these are a few tips for fire prevention around your lot. While our landscapers take care of the front, take a look at the sides and back of your property to see how you're doing:

• Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds (vegetation).

• Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.

 Remove branches that hang over your roof and keep dead branches 10 feet away from your chimney.

• Trim trees regularly to keep branches a minimum of 10 feet from other trees.

 Remove or prune flammable plants and shrubs near windows.

 Remove vegetation and flammable items from around and under decks. For more information, visit readyforwildfire.org.

REMINDER TO OBTAIN ACC APPROVAL

Exterior changes to homes, windows, fences, garage doors, paint colors, gates or roofs must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) BEFORE work begins. Request forms are available in the clubhouse, online at Chantarelle.org, from ACC committee members and from Strong Management. Completed forms must be submitted to the ACC at least 30 days before the start of the project to allow time for review and follow-up. When projects involve common area fences shared by both the homeowner and the HOA, additional procedures mentioned in the May 2012 "Report on Common Area Fences" must be followed. including obtaining multiple bids. An additional item has been added to the ACC approval process regarding the display of flags. The American Stars and Stripes, individual state flags, and seasonal/ holiday flags may in most cases be flown without permission. Permission to fly other flags must be requested from the ACC. Adhering to ACC rules will ensure the continued coherence and beauty of the Chantarelle community, while at John Dodgshon@hotmail.com. the same time maintaining the quality of life and desirability of residing here.
