Back Country Horsemen of New Mexico Ride Rules & Trail Etiquette 2018

- 1. No stallions or intact jacks are allowed on trail rides.
- 2. Keep your equine one animal length behind others.
- 3. Equines that are known kickers must have a red ribbon tied to their tail or tack that is visible from the rear.
- 4. Do not stop unnecessarily. If a stop is necessary, move off to the side of the trail, and advise the trail boss that you are stopping.
- 5. Stay behind the Trail Boss at all times.
- 6. Do not lag behind the group; stay in front of the drag rider and with the rider in front within sight.
- 7. Do not run or trot up behind another animal.
- 8. Pack animals must be under control and on a lead rope.
- 9. When passing, advise the riders in front of your intention. Pass at a walk.
- 10. Stay on designated trails.
- 11. Riding double is not permitted.
- 12. Ride single file in hazardous areas.
- 13. Dogs are not allowed on trail rides.
- 14. If you bring it in, you pack it out.
- 15. Leave all gates as you found them.
- 16. No smoking on the trail.

These minimal ride rules are to ensure that every rider has a safe, enjoyable ride. There are numerous other rules that could be listed, but if <u>common sense</u> is used, they are not needed.
