A LIFE OF TRUE REPENTANCE

(Ezekiel 18:25-28; Ps. 25:4-9; Phil. 2:1-11; Matt. 21:28-32)

"Thus says the Lord: You say, The Lord's way is not fair...Is it My way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?"

Last Sunday, through Prophet Isaiah, the Lord revealed to us that His *ways are not our ways, and His thoughts are not our thoughts*. The theme of God's magnificence and compassion runs through today's scripture readings. Very often we are overwhelmed by His merciful love and compassion. We find it difficult to comprehend or understand God's sense of justice. As human beings, subjective in our thinking and in our judging of others and ourselves, we wish God would be as subjective and circumstantial as we are.

When the Jews were under Babylonian captivity, they suffered pain and oppression. Their cities and the Temple in Jerusalem were destroyed, and they concluded that God had punished them for the sins of previous generations. Thus, they complained that God was not fair. The Lord you and I serve is certainly not a God Who prepares fire and brimstone in order to punish and destroy His children. He is the God of love, mercy and compassion. He does not wish that we die with our sins, rather He wants us to repent, turn away from our sins and reconcile with Him. Instead of perceiving God as one who sends us to the fires of Hell, we should be men and women who take responsibility for our actions. Whenever we sin, we are making a decision to turn away from life, and to embrace death. Therefore, Prophet Ezekiel reminds us today, "When someone virtuous turns away from virtue to commit iniquity and dies, it is because of the iniquity he committed that he must die." The emotional, spiritual or the material death of such a person is the consequence of his/her actions - of turning away from God's love to sin.

In the response to the psalm you and I plead, "Remember Your mercies, O Lord." Yes, the Lord will always remember His mercies because He is "MERCY-FULL". But He wants you and me to take responsibility for our actions - our sinfulness. We must leave our old ways behind and return to Him. The freewill God has given to us and the human freedom we enjoy requires full responsibility for what we do and should do. It is only when we admit our guilt and do not project it to others - when we individually admit, "that I have sinned through my own fault, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do" - that God can forgive us our sins. To be able to gain entrance into God's Kingdom, we must humble ourselves, repent, turn away from our sins and reconcile with God our Father, because "if someone wicked turns from the wickedness...does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life, since he has turned away from all the sins that he has committed, he shall surely live, he shall not die."

We should not think that because we are baptized we will gain automatic entry into Heaven – there should not be any complacency in our practice of the faith. Such an attitude would mean that we are behaving just like the *first son* in Jesus' parable in today's gospel. Instead, we should behave like the *second son*, who initially said, "I will not," but later repented. By our past sins, you and I have said, "I will not" to God and His commands. It is high time we repented, confessed our sins, turned away from them, and lived according to God's commandments, so that like other repentant sinners (the tax collectors and prostitutes), we might gain entrance into God's kingdom.
