First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all because of your demonstrated faith. Romans 1:8

Greetings to you in the holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer. I hope you are basking in God's love and continuing to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ.

As the author of Romans 1:8 thanked God for the Roman congregation, I thank God for your faithfulness to him. Your devotion to godliness is manifested in the many ways you serve God through the ministries of United Presbyterian Church Plainfield (UPC).

One of those ministries is hospitality, in which everyone participates. Hospitality includes exhibiting generosity of spirit to those worshipping with us in person and online. Your friendliness makes folk feel welcome and valued. When visitors who attend our in-person service follow up with me, they invariably mention their gratitude to God for the warm reception they received at United.

Likewise, online worshippers express having experienced the same degree of warmth. The evidence is reflected in the number of visitors who pay return visits to our Sunday and Thursday services. It is also shown by the high level of engagement during service, among members, and between UPC members and visitors.

Members greet each other and visitors by name. This makes worshippers feel they are part of the service and congregation. The conscious exchanging of greetings and praising God uninhibitedly with words and by posting emojis further attests to the ease visitors feel when worshipping at UPC.

I encourage you to keep up the virtuous work and take heart, knowing your efforts are bearing good fruit.

Now, for the latest news regarding our Helping Homeless Families (HHF) mission project. In July, thanks to your help, United donated about 1,400 disposable baby diapers to families living in the Newark YM/YWCA homeless shelter. Pictures of UPC youth delivering the diapers are included in this newsletter.

Praise God, today, August 28, 2022, we met our objective to collect 100 new baby bottles and nearly tripled the number of baby wipes we hoped to collect.

HHF project's short-term goals include continuing to support families with small children. We also hope to provide the shelter with the requested essential bath items.

The following breakdown highlights the 2022 timetable for fulfilling our HHF pledge.

- The week of September 5, deliver baby bottles and wipes.
- November 24, donate 1,000 new bath towels and 1,000 washcloths.
- December 15, donate 150 beauty care packages to women and girls living in the Newark Y.

To participate in the HHF project, either bring or have new items sent directly to the church. Every contribution will help us meet our goal of improving the quality of life for some of our most vulnerable neighbors. Please do not send money.

Brothers and sisters, may the grace of Christ continue guiding our mission giving.



# United Presbyterian Church BUILDING FUND

#### As of 8/30/22 the total collected is \$7,610

# **INTERACTIVE STEM PROGRAM**



The Plainfield Grassroots CDC is happy to announce our new **Out of the Box** science club program starting in **February 2021**. In this ALL NEW STEM program, administered by Mad Science, students are introduced to science using hands-on, inquirybased approach in a fun and entertaining way.

CDC The club meets virtually weekly, for 8 weeks. Class is open to children ages 8-13. Classes are offered strictly on a first-come,

first-served basis. Please look at the days and dates carefully, as there are no makeup classes for individual absences. Makeup classes will only be scheduled for cancelled classes.

#### The Mad Side of Science

Classes will meet on Saturdays from 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm Class Dates: 2/6, 2/13, 2/20, 2/27, 3/6, 3/13, 3/20, 3/27

#### Cost: \$25/student\*

Kids learn about how wide a field science is. They can take a look at how Detectives catch the bad guys, how do 3-D movies work, and learn how the weatherman predicts the weather.

Your child will receive a package with weekly take-home projects that we will do during the class. Before the class begins we will send the Zoom link and a list of simple items from home that will help your child get the most from our program.

#### Registrations are handled directly through the <u>Mad Science website</u> on a first-come, first-served basis.





# CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

# The Dishonest Manager

Theme: Honesty

**Object:** A Bible; masking tape

Scripture: Luke 16:1-13

Divide the room in half with a masking tape line.

Today we'll be learning from Jesus about honesty. Let's do an activity to help us think about honesty before we hear what Jesus says about it. (Have the kids gather along the masking tape line.)

Pretend your mom gave you two cookies to bring to your next door neighbor. This is your favorite kind of cookie, and it smells so good! Your mom said after you come back from your neighbor's and eat some lunch, then you'd get to have four cookies, but you're hungry right now.

When I say "Go," if you think the right choice is to eat one cookie on the way to your neighbor's—he would never know, right—go to this side of the room. (Point to one side of the room.) If you think the right choice is to bring both the cookies to your neighbor and return home for lunch, you'll go to this side of the room. (Point to the opposite side of the room.) Go! (Pause, and allow kids to make their choice.)

The honest or trustworthy choice is to give your neighbor the two cookies. If you can be trusted with two cookies, then you can be trusted with many cookies, right?

Have kids return to the line, and repeat the same process for the following scenarios:

- Grandma gave you \$10 to buy her a soda at the church craft show. After you do, you notice you have enough money leftover to buy a cool toy you saw. Do you bring the change back to grandma, or do you use the money to buy the toy before you go back to her?
- You're at the arcade and you find a wallet with \$30 in it, but there's nothing in it that says the name of the owner. Do you put the \$30 in your pocket and leave the wallet where it is, or do you turn the wallet into the lost-and-found?

Honesty is shown by both what we say and what we do. We always have a choice—like we did in our activity—to be honest about what we say and do. And when we're honest with small, easy things, then Jesus says we can be trusted with bigger and harder choices.

Jesus told a story about a rich man who had a manager working for him who was dishonest. The rich man asked his manager to explain how he'd been using the rich man's money, and sure enough, he had been taking some of the money for himself and cheating his employer.

- What do you think happened, and why?
- Explain whether you would trust the worker if you were his boss.

The manager was fired, but before he was, he made up a plan to make some friends who could help him when he was out of work. He went to all the people who owed his employer. He found out how much they each owed, and said they could pay a much smaller amount, if they paid now. These people were happy to pay a fraction of what they owed, and the manager became their friend since he gave them a discount.

After Jesus told this parable, he said to his disciples, "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much." If people know that they can trust us in small things, they will know that they can trust us in the big things too.

#### **Prayer:**

God, help us to remember what Jesus taught about honesty--and help us to be honest in every situation--big or small. In Jesus' name, amen.
