"Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' # Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

28<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 22:1-14

"Don't wear white to a wedding." That is a common fashion guideline for people attending weddings, and the idea behind it is that the bride alone wears 'White'. This prevents the bride from being upstaged or someone else being mistaken for the bride. I am not sure a bouncer would throw you out for wearing white, but wearing her color, may not be good manners or in keeping with the custom to honor the bride on her wedding day. We have a similar type situation in the gospel parable today when a man is thrown out of a wedding banquet because he is not wearing the appropriate attire. We only hear about one person being ejected, so maybe he was the only person not to get the memo! But what is that all about? Some bible scholars suggest that the man refused to go along with the banquet customs, and one of the customs was to wear a decorative family cloak that the family would give you at the door (like a wedding favor gift for guests). You'd look like a wedding crasher if you didn't wear the family-issued cloak. Maybe like how people get a hand stamp at a bar to prove their age, or everyone wears a 'birthday hat' at a birthday (ice cream) party! By not joining in the 'reindeer' games, the man was arrogantly drawing attention to himself and upstaging the groom. So, Out he goes! We can understand that certain places demand certain dress codes. (Most invitations include a note about the expected 'dress style' -Formal, Casual, or Thematic). So, even though the man was indiscriminately drawn in off the street to attend the free banquet, he still needed to honor the host and abide by the dress code.

But on a simpler level, I think we can understand this 'vetting' of the 'open invitation' guest list as a general way of the host exerting some discipline and expectation of order for the banquet event to occur smoothly. (If the banquet is symbolic of the Kingdon of God, then Jesus is saying that even though anyone can be dragged into the heavenly banquet ('good and bad alike' Matt 22:10), there is still a screening process before final admittance.) On a first hearing of this parable, we may get the idea that 'anything goes' at the banquet – just pull them in from the streets -No Rules! But, by this man being screened and ultimately thrown out means that even though the invitation is wide and open, there is still an expected norm to observe and expectation to be met to be allowed in the door. If we compare this banquet hall to the saintly feasting in heaven, then one lesson of Jesus' parable is that even though we are all invited to heaven's feast, we must meet at least a basic condition or already have fulfilled a certain duty to be admitted. All of us are called to heaven, but do we all get there? The minimum expectations may be that we are 'clothed in Christ through baptism' (Galatians 3:27 & Romans 13:14). But also, we must 'want to' be there to get in, and to accept Christ and His life beforehand, working to imitate His Way in our own lives (to 'look-like' Him-wear His clothes-His Sign).

With this element of screening that happens at the door of the banquet, this parable is similar to other 'vetting' or 'sorting out of good from bad' that shows up in other Jesus-parables about Final Judgement and Heaven. For example, in Matthew 13:47-50, we hear about a net that scoops up everything, but is hauled ashore for the sorting out process to begin, good fish being kept and the bad cast away. Also, in Matthew 25:31-46, we hear about a separation of sheep from goats at the Final Judgement. In Matthew 25:1-13 about ten virgins with lamps, we hear that the five wise ones are let, while the five foolish ones are vetted and turned away at the door for not being prepared ahead of time. Jesus warned about this 'sorting out' that comes at the end, when early on, in Matthew 7:13-14, He said, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few.'

In summary, there is a common theme running through all of these parables about the Kingdom of Heaven. Even though God calls and invites everyone to heaven we have to want to enter with Him. And even though He may bring some people to the very door of heaven with or without their efforts, still, at that point we have to accept and want Him. He will 'cover' us at the door with His grace, admitting us if we seek/ask Him. But we do not want to arrogantly presume His grace or take His invitation for granted!
