

2nd Sunday of Lent (Year B) Sunday 25 February 2024

"I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the Land of the living"

Last week, the wilderness was the place where Jesus came to terms with the limits of His humanity and looking beyond those limits, from the core of His heart placed His trust in the love of God to be with Him for His whole journey of life – whatever might unfold. This week, the focus is a mountain that Jesus ascends accompanied by three of His chosen disciples and experiences a Divine Presence.

In scripture mountains are places in which encounters and revelation from God occurred. Abraham, Moses and Elijah received commissioning from God to His people on mountain peaks – meeting places of heaven and earth.

The transfiguration of Jesus takes place on a mountain top. This occurs a time when Jesus has accepted His likely fate: if He continues to challenge oppression and injustice, He is certain to encounter opposition, even death. Jesus has already discussed this with His disciples which Peter could not understand or accept. "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let them deny themselves, take up their cross and follow me...." (Mark 8:34)

So Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a mountain away from the everyday distractions of life to be alone for a while. There they experienced Him as they had never seen Him before and are in awe as Moses and Elijah appear before them in conversation with Jesus.


Peter, overcome by the experience wants to stay in the moment of glory and set up three tents for Moses, Elijah and Jesus. But that is not the way of discipleship. God speaks: 'This is my Son the Beloved One. Listen to him!!!' Following the path of Jesus will be nothing less than undertaking God's mission to the whole of humanityand not without cost.

Like Jesus and His companions, we too need occasional glimpses of glory when we become overwhelmed by challenges facing us as we strive to love and be faithful to the values that are important to us as followers of Jesus the Beloved Son. At such times we need a bit of time to draw apart to a quiet place - a mountain - to sense the reality of God's presence in our lives. But we cannot stay on the mountain in devotional solitude forever. Sooner or later we must come down from our mountain and continue life in the way Jesus beckons us "I am among you as one who serves" (Luke 22). We are called to be in practical ways the image of God's mercy in our families, our neighbourhoods and especially towards the suffering, poor, mistreated, abused and ignored amongst us. - in the words of today's psalm 'walking in the

presence of the Lord in the Land of the living'.

GOSPEL

Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then

Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
