This is the second year of the Houghs Neck Congregational Church Sunday School vegetable garden, sponsored by Katie's Krops. Katie's Krops is a nonprofit organization focused on empowering young growers to plant vegetables gardens and donate the harvest to organizations in their communities that help people in need. Last year, the Sunday school took over the planting and maintaining of the garden behind the Houghs Neck Congregational Church that was started by Troop 6 Eagle Scout, Alex Samsel. Sunday school teacher, Laurie Pavidis, wanted our children to have a community service project that they could really participate in and see the rewards of giving back to their community. Last year, the Sunday School students harvested and donated over 300 pounds of fresh vegetables to Interfaith Social Services in Quincy. This year, the Sunday School is hoping to match, if not surpass, last year's total donations of fresh produce.

This past month, Cassandra Gordon, a 6th grader and member of the Sunday School, represented our church and attended the 4th annual Katie's KropsCamp at the WP Rawl Farm in South Carolina. The camp educates young growers, between the ages of 9 and 16, on agriculture and the environment. The three day camp included workshops on growing practices, social media and keeping away garden pests. The last day of the camp, the growers took part in a service project expanding a Katie's Krops garden in a nearby town. The campers also learned a ton from each other about different ways to garden, interesting crops to try, and ways to expand the reach into the community.

The camp and the garden have truly helped our Sunday School appreciate what a huge difference a little effort can make to the folks in your community! We encourage everyone to come down and check out our garden, and if you would like more information about starting your own garden or where to donate your extra veggies, please let us know!

**High School Summer Mission July 23 ~ 30** About 15 High School students have signed up so far, for a Week Long Mission to assist a community in Maine.

Teams of 5-7 youths and 2 adults (always one male and one female) will be assigned a specific work site in the community. As a team they will work together at the specific site and at the Beyond Sunday Mission Homestead. Teams will take turns preparing meals, cleaning the Homestead and creating prayer experiences for the rest of the group.

Work days begin with morning wake-up at 7:00 a.m., prayer, breakfast and then off to the worksites by 8:30 a.m. The length of time spent at a worksite is contingent upon the work being done there, as well as the weather. The groups usually return to the Homestead by 4:00 p.m. Evenings are spent in a variety of ways. We generally participate in challenging team building activities, prayer experiences and journaling. One day during the week is a rest day and

Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

I hope you and your families had a safe and enjoyable 4th of July. I enjoyed meeting many of your families at the Houghs Neck Community Council's July 3rd Family Fun Day on Edgewater Drive.

There is much activity at the State House as we head into the final weeks of formal session, which will end on July 31st. The Legislature approved the Conference Committee's Fiscal Year 2017 State Budget on June 30th, the last day of the fiscal year. The Governor has ten calendar days to review the budget and take action. The Governor can sign it in whole or in part. He can veto the entire state budget or veto specific budgetary provisions, known as a line item veto. He can also amend or veto specific non-budgetary language known as outside sections. The Legislature can override the vetoes with a two-thirds vote. In the instance that the Governor contributes amendments, the Legislature can adopt the Governor's amendments or further amend the Governor's amendments and send it back to the Governor for his approval. The Governor can either accept or veto the further amendments. If he vetoes the changes, the Legislature can once again override the veto with a two-thirds vote.

The Conference Committee's Fiscal Year 2017 State Budget is \$39.1 billion. This is smaller than the \$39.4 billion that the House approved in April and the Governor's recommendation of \$39.5 billion

from February. The Fiscal Year 2017 budget revenue projections have changed based on the reduction in this year's income tax collections and other unforeseen events that will have vast economic impacts. Great Britain's vote to leave the European Union has had a negative global impact estimated at over \$2 trillion. Massachusetts, as part of the global economy, will experience the effects of this impact throughout the year. Massachusetts' top 10 foreign exports and imports trading partners include Great Britain, France, Germany, Switzerland and Ireland. Given these changes, the House, Senate and Governor have agreed upon a new fiscal year 2017 budget projection. The original budget projection of a 4.3% increase (approximately \$1.1 billion) has been reduced to 2.7% (approximately \$677 million). The Conference Committee, whose job it is to negotiate the differences between the House and Senate versions of the budget, have opted for the lower of either the House or Senate funding allocations for certain programs. Capital gains revenue directed to the state's stabilization "rainy day" fund has been redirected to address the budget deficit. The change in the economic forecast now suggests that the projected 0.05% reduction in income tax is unlikely to occur. The combination of reduced spending and the redirection of revenue should lessen the possibility of additional budgetary cuts during the fiscal year.

The Legislature has sent the "Massachusetts Veterans' Home

Act", House Bill 4285, to the Governor's desk. I explained many of the benefits included in the legislation in my June Bulletin, but would like to expand upon additional benefits that are included in the legislation. Silver Star recipients would be exempt from taking the civil service exam. Previously, the civil service exam exception only applied to Congressional Medal of Honor, Distinguished Service Cross and Navy Cross recipients. The excise tax exemption is extended to all veterans who are deployed. Municipalities are prohibited from transferring debt payments to a

third party if the debtor notifies the municipality that he or she is a veteran. Gold Star license plate eligibility is expanded to incorporate surviving family members including nieces and nephews in instances where the veteran killed in action has no surviving parents or children. Businesses with fifty or more employees must grant paid leave of absence on Veterans Day. Lastly, Bicentennial Park in Fall River will become the new home to the Massachusetts Gold Star Families Memorial Monument.

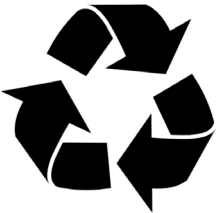
