Library report:

Recent additions to the library include a volume found at a home that had been checked out years ago. A Commentary on the Gospel According to John was given by Mr. & Mrs. James Chamberlain in memory of Paul H. Clark. This book had not been cataloged, so it has been added to the present collection. A new volume: Questions and Answers: Open forum was given by Barbara (and Gene) Carter in memory of Jack Jenkins. How to Train Your Dragon was donated to the library...donor unknown. The latest volume of the Freed-Hardeman lectures has been given by Gary & Cynthia Wilder in memory of Denton Ramsey.

The library contains one of the most complete sets of Freed-Hardeman lectures that you will find anywhere. This is due to a generous donation from two members here. This set begins with 1970 and is current through 2020. The 1984 volume contains an index for 1970—1984. The 1994 volume contains an index for 1985—1994. The lectureship actually began in the 1930's. Good lectureships usually provide rich material on the subjects being considered. These volumes are good references for preachers and Bible class teachers to consult in preparing lessons. Editor note: You will get great use out of studying these volumes from the Freed Lectures if you use the index. Indexing all the many things mentioned at lectures is critical for finding what you want. I would start there with the index if you have any topics you have wondered about and desire some detailed teaching on them.

Suppose for a moment that your son died in a heroic rescue of your neighbor and his family. Suppose one night you neighbors house caught on fire. They were unaware of the danger to their lives, your son saw the fire, realized the danger, and knowing the danger to himself still ran in to rescue that family. In the rescue he had to pull both the husband and wife from the burning building. Then he returned three more times to carry out each of the three children. After everyone was safe, your son sat down under the tree in the front yard and died. The physical exertion and breathing the smoke and the fumes were all too much. He died giving his life for others.

How would you feel if your neighbor failed to attend your son's funeral with the excuse-- "I forgot," "I didn't wake up on time," "My clock didn't go off," "I didn't feel good," "Went fishing."

Each Lord's Day, we have memorial services to remember that God's Son died for us. I plan to be there to show my appreciation and love. How about you?
