Bloomington Boat Parade will once again be a contest for the annual **Ranney Cup** which was awarded to Kahlfeldts of Night Hawk Road. This award goes to the boat with the best themed decorations along with the greatest spirit. Coincidently, the Kahlfeldts have graciously been the Grand Marshalls of the Parade for several years. Thank you George and Marlene!

Parade - it is also a time to say thank you to Cindy and Keith Ranney for their 12 years of service coordinating these events. To memorialize their efforts, the winner of the boat parade will be the recipient of the annual "Ranney Cup"! The Ranney Cup trophy will be passed on year to year to the winner. Along with the trophy they will receive gift certificates to our local fine dining establishments. Please plan to join in on the fun!

Lodge, 3:00 pm, and your Parade Marshall will lead you through the traditional route. The parade judges will be following so be sure to finish the route. The Fourth of July falls on a Saturday this year, so with a little good weather, it promises to be a great weekend on the lake.

Fireworks will once again be provided by Melrose Pyrotechnics. These are of course in addition to some pretty fantastic 'local' displays that pop up around the lake. Please be safe as you participate in private displays; we want a safe and uneventful celebration. The lake's display will start just after dusk. This will probably be around 9:00 PM, but will only be started as soon as the night sky is ready to provide a great contrast for the fireworks. While we plan on good weather, there is always the possibility of rain. Should this happen, we will try to make a decision about cancellation no later than 8:30 PM. We will ask that this decision be broadcast on WJBC, or you may call me at (309)212-0445. In the event we do cancel, the display will be held on the 5th at the same time.

I just want to remind everyone that boat stickers are required for Lake Bloomington. If you have not purchased one yet, please stop by the Parks Office and pick up the application. We may be on the lake or patrolling the roads, so if we are not here, please grab an application out of the silver box in front of our door. Please fill out the application, along with a copy of your insurance and drop it, along with your check (no cash please) in the payment drop box. We will mail out your sticker to you after we process your application.

Also, please remember to follow the rules for Lake Bloomington. Swimming is prohibited on the lake except for within 100 feet of your dock. Please follow the "No Wake Zones" require-

ments. These are the two most commonly broken rules. By speeding in the "No Wake Zone," we are advancing the problems of erosion on this beautiful lake.

I work Thursday through Sunday, usually 5am to 3pm or from 8am to 6pm. We only have one boat and we cannot be everywhere at once, so if you see someone violating the rules, do not hesitate to call me, even on my days off. I can get in touch with the employees at the Parks Office. My cell number is 309-251-5401 or my email is josephdarter@gmail.com.

We are currently working on getting 23 new buoys ordered. It is a long process, made longer because of the high cost of the buoys. As soon as we get them delivered, we will be placing 3

"No Wake Zone" buoys in Money Creek and 3 more in Hickory Creek and the rest will be used to replace old and broken buoys and to protect the water in-take area behind the water treatment plant, as well as to slow people down when coming around the bend by the Mucky Duck Marina.

We kindly ask for your patience while we work to improve our operations, especially with regards to issuing citations. As with everything, changing the culture will take a long time but change will come. I promise.

Be Aware!

All boats must have a current state and city licenses/stickers. Any boat on the water must be registered and have the Lake Bloomington sticker displayed on the port (left side) above the water line. Lake Patrol will begin issuing citations July 1 for violations to this policy.

Three New Boating Laws for 2015

Senate Bill 3434 allows for the seizure of a watercraft used in the commission of certain offenses related to operating under the influence. The new rules bring penalties for boating under the influence more in line with those for operating a motor vehicle while impaired by drugs or alcohol.

Senate Bill 3433 requires all persons born after January 1, 1998, to take and pass a boating safety course validated by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and hold a valid boating safety certificate before they can operate a motorboat with an engine over 10 horsepower.

Senate Bill 2731 mandates that the operator of any watercraft that is towing a person, such as a water skier or tuber, must display a bright orange flag measuring not less than 12 inches per side. The flag must be displayed to indicate a downed water skier, a water skier in the water preparing to ski, a water skiing line extended from the motorboat, or a ski in the water in the vicinity of the motorboat. This applies to anyone engaged in any activity where a person is towed behind or alongside a motorboat, including, but not limited to, barefoot skiing, tubing, skiing on other contrivances, wake boarding, and parasailing.

During their research, they learned that Gus Belt, founder of Steak n Shake, once managed the Lake Road Inn, and local lore claims that he perfected what became the famous Steakburger here. He was also a part of bringing the now famous Friday night fish fry to the Lake Road Inn. This tradition will continue on Friday nights.

The menu will continue to offer local favorites, as well as adding some new options. One of the biggest additions is a pizza oven. "I'm really excited to be able to bring fresh, homemade pizza to the lake. When we wanted pizza, it was always a hassle to drive into town to get it. We thought pizza would be a welcome addition to other residents," said Craig.

The Hansons have also added some specialty beers, upper shelf liquor, and a better wine selection, including sangria and Chianti.

There are daily specials for lunch and dinner. Monday - Saturday, they open for lunch at 11:30. Sundays they open at noon. The full menu will be available The historic Lake Road Inn was opened until 9 pm daily, and pizza until 11 pm.

> They are also in the process of making some changes inside and out. Parking lot lights have been added and some landscaping changes will be made. Future enhancements are in the planning stages and will be announced later.

Inside, new TVs have been added for sports fans who may want to catch a game during dinner or in the bar. The pool table is now available to play free of charge.

Craig and Teri are also in the process of redecorating to get more of a lake feel. Photos will be showcased on the walls depicting the rich history of Lake Bloomington.

"Teri's family has had ties to the Lake since the 1950s when her grandparents Ron and Nola Smith built a cabin here. Ron Smith is a big part of the Lake's

history and was instrumental in making the lake what it is today, so we wanted to bring some of that history into the décor. We are a Lake Bloomington establishment, and thought we should reflect that in the design, " said Craig.

"We are looking forward to meeting more of our Lake neighbors and hope you'll stop in and check us out," Craig added.

Sharing the Road

Summer weather brings more than boats to our area. It also brings more cars touring our lovely lake, more bicyclists, and more pedestrians. All of these groups are meant to share the roadways. That sharing will work better if everyone remembers a few simple rules and courtesies. We've already observed some very "close calls."

Drivers: remember to keep your car three feet from bicycles and pedestrians. Also remember that school age children are likely to be on the roads so keep your speed down, and watch out!

Bikers: remember we must follow the Rules of the Road, too. Stop at stop signs, and use hand signals before turning. Keep to a single file on the right side of the roadway as traffic approaches. Also, as you come up behind pedestrians, signal your presence, a shout of "biker on your left" for instance, will cause people to clear your path and help them control their animals.

Pedestrians: move to a single file on the right side of the road as traffic approaches. Always keep your attention tuned to traffic, do not blast your I-pod so that you cannot hear cars approaching.
