HELPING OUR YETTEM NEIGHBORS

This past weekend of February 25th and 26th, the Yettem and Seville areas experienced severe flooding prompting Tulare County Fire officials to suggest voluntary evacuations for residents whose homes were affected.

We were asked by the county if emergency responders could use our church parking lot as a temporary base for emergency crews. Avenue 384 was closed off in both directions at Road 144 (the road just east of church) and Road 132 (Ben Maddox) from Saturday at noon to Sunday. Our lot was also used for residents to come and fill sandbags to keep water from entering their homes and for work crews to create barriers along the irrigation ditch. Our church was not in danger of flooding. Water continued to flow down the ditch from higher elevations even after the rains subsided.

Church services were canceled because of the road closure. County officials expressed their appreciation for our cooperation.

St. Mary Ladies Society Meeting ~PROGRAM~ VARTANANTS

The Battle of Avarayr (Udunujnh ճակատամարտ [battle]) was fought on 2 June 451 (wiki), 26 May 451 (Yeghishe), on the Avarayr Plain in Vaspouragan, a province of the ancient kingdom of Armenia in southeastern Turkey and northwestern Iran. The battle was between a Christian Armenian army, under Sparabed [General] Vartan Mamigonian, and Sassanid Persia. It is considered one of the first battles in defense of the Christian faith. Although the Persians were victorious on the battlefield, the battle proved to be a major strategic victory for Armenians, as Avarayr paved the way to the Nvarsak Treaty of 484 AD, which affirmed Armenia's right to practice Christianity freely.

The battle is not even mentioned in Persian history accounts. It is seen as one of the most significant events in Armenian history. It was a bloody clash between two unequal forces: 66,000 poorly equipped Armenians against 300,000 well-trained and well-armed Persians. It lasted from sunrise to sunset, one day. The mortal remains of the commander of the Armenian forces, Vartan Mamigonian, and 1035 of his followers were strewn on the battleground. Vartan Mamigonian is considered a national hero and has been canonized by the Armenian Apostolic Church.

Yeghisheh's *History of Vartan and the Armenian War* describes the heroism of the Armenian people of the fifth century. It is his eye-witness story. Yeghisheh was a vartabed, one of the youngest pupils of St. Sahag (Catholicos) and St. Mesrob Mashdots.

The book describes everything leading up to and beyond that fateful day. During one attack, Yeghisheh notes one good fighter roared like a lion and attacked like a wild boar. His name was Arshavir.

There was a traitor, Vasag. The Persians told him he was the rightful king, but he even embezzled taxes intended for the Persians. He had his uncle assassinated. He was eventually thrown into a dungeon. Yeghisheh writes that he died like a dog. No Armenian ever names his child Vasag.

Ghevont Yerets* is remembered as the priest who, on the night before the decisive battle against the Persians, assembled the Armenian troops on the battlefield and baptized those that not yet been received into the Church. St. Ghevont then celebrated the Divine Liturgy and distributed Holy Communion to every soldier. (*Yerets τρτα means priest. Gunig Geen μυήμ μηυ means wife/woman. Priest's wife = Yeretsgin τηταμήν.)

The Persian religion was Zoroastrianism. It contains both monotheistic and dualistic elements, dualistic meaning good and evil, light (sun, fire) and dark. Ahura Mazda is the benevolent deity, Ahriman, the destructive spirit.

There were many letters between the Persians and Armenians leading up to the battle. The Persian king demanded and tortured the Armenians to become Zoroastrians. The Grand Vizier sent a long letter in which he writes "Be it known to you that every man who dwells beneath the heavens and holds not the Mazdean religion, is deaf and blind and is deceived by the devils of Ahriman."

Eighteen Bishops answered this epistle. In Yeghisheh's book, their letter takes up over seven pages. The powerful conclusion is well-known to us:

"From this faith no one can shake us, neither angels nor men; neither sword, nor fire, nor water, nor any, nor all other horrid tortures. ...

Our bond of faith is ... with God to Whom we are indissolubly bound and from Whom nothing can detach and separate us, neither now, nor later, nor forever, nor forever and ever."


