7 Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains. 8 You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near. 9 Don't grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door! 10 Brothers and sisters, as an example of patience in the face of suffering, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. 11 As you know, we count as blessed those who have persevered. You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy. James 5:7-11



One of the main disciplines our modern world has robbed us of is patience. The march of technological progress has shortened the wait for nearly everything in our lives. Amazon can deliver almost anything to your door in a few days. Our global markets and transportation mean we can eat grapes from Argentina in the dead of winter in Minnesota instead of waiting for another growing season. Our television is "on-demand" instead of waiting for scheduled showings and just the other day I saw an app that loans you your paycheck before it even arrives! As a parent, I find myself manufacturing lessons on patience with my children because they seem so far and few between.

Having just returned from a trip to my hometown in Michigan, I was reminded that the rural places in our country are still rich with lessons on patience. While technology has even changed the speed at which agriculture moves, the very nature of agriculture demands patience. The land and animals teach us that growth takes time, a harvest takes time, and new life takes time to arrive - they simply cannot be rushed. Whether we like it or not, our connection to the land teaches us patience and perseverance in the face of difficult circumstances. Even the weather and the distance between things out here teaches us patience.

I chuckle to myself when I think of how excruciatingly long my childhood trips to Grandma and Grandpa's felt -- a whopping 30-minute drive! Memories of those trips with my brothers in the back seat are vivid reminders of how a lack of patience can lead to grumbling and fighting. There is a parallel to our Christian life -- we too are waiting to arrive, or should I say, waiting for an arrival. Our hope is hung on the return of Jesus Christ, and as we follow Christ's leading in the meantime, the journey can feel long and full of trouble.

James' message to the believers in the verses above speaks to us now. We are a people in waiting, and depending on our circumstances as Christians, the waiting might seem near impossible. Our suffering may be so great that we are tempted to turn on one another or abandon the faith altogether. For others, the wait may not be difficult at all and so we lose that sense of the imminent return of Christ. James would have us take neither of those routes. Instead, he asks us to be like a patient farmer who has learned to patiently and expectantly trust God, no matter the weather.


Thrivent Foodshelf Challenge
