AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Top Stories of 2022 – The Year in Review

Taking a look at the year of 2022 here are some of the most important "News and Notes" items appearing in the Amana Society Bulletin.

Marengo Explosion and Fire Repercussions Felt – Amana Fire Department members were among 200 emergency responders at a Thursday, Dec. 8 explosion and fire at the C6-Zero asphalt shingle recycling factory. Over 10 people were injured, two were critically injured. Six Amana fire fighting suits/breathing units were damaged.

Damage to Amana's Main Street – November 24 a black Chevrolet pickup driven by Zachary Poulson careened down Main Street with Benton County law enforcement in pursuit. Poulson was apprehended, on foot, in a ditch near East Amana.

Headstone Found and Returned to High Amana – A gravestone taken from the High Amana Cemetery was found near the Koszta boat ramp by a fisherman November 5. The 250-pound marble head stone (it was that of a military veteran) was removed from the cemetery sometime before October 30.

TKM Announces 2023 Stage Shows at APAC – September 29 Tom Milligan and Deb Kennedy of TKM Theatrical Productions announced that they would be producing shows at the Amana Performing Arts Center in 2023. They had just drawn the curtain on their well received comedy, "Leaving Iowa."

Neighbors Organize to Help Heart Recipient – Friends and neighbors of Dan Ray and his family set up a "Go Fund Me" page after Ray underwent a heart transplant. He returned home to Middle Amana after 101 days in the hospital September 15.

It's Been 90 Years Since Amana's Great Change – 1932 was the year that Amana's communal way of life was set aside and the Amana Society, Inc. was formed to move the community forward. 1932 ended 89 years of organized communal living.

Homestead Water Tower Repairs – September 1 it was reported that the Homestead water tower was still swathed in protective wrap as it was being repaired and upgraded. The work was to be completed September 9.

Amana is at the Iowa State Fair – August 19 it was reported that for the first time in 10 years the Amanas had a presence at the Iowa State Fair with a "Visit the Colonies" booth in the Varied Industries building. Volunteers from the community manned the booth.

Amana Jingle Cross GX Bike Race is Not Happening – July 6 the Iowa City based Jingle Cross group announced it would not be hosting an international bike race in the Amanas August. 5 – 7. The reasons were numerous but vague.

Ruedy Kitchen House Museum a Must See – Opening in May of 2022, the Ruedy family residence is now a historic site, part of the Amana Heritage Society's Communal Kitchen in Middle Amana. A grand opening was held in May.

Restore Revive Renew Amana Church Fund Drive Receives Support - The Amana Church's campaign to raise money to restore, revive and renew the Amana Church building in Amana and the Kinderschule in Middle Amana receives a \$50,000 pledge from the Amana Society, Inc. and a \$8,500 grant from the Community Foundation of Eastern Iowa, Iowa County. The Kinderschule will be the new home of the Amana Colonies Food Pantry. The Amana Church will receive much needed repairs and building restoration plus the installation of handicapped ramps. The Amana Church has been named a recipient of a Sacred Places project grant from the National Fund for Sacred Places, a program in collaboration with the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Chinese Delegation Visits Amana – Qin Gang, China's Ambassador to the United States, visited the Amanas for a late supper at the Ox Yoke Inn, Amana, with his delegation and Kenneth Quinn, President Emeritus of the World Food Prize. After arriving at the Eastern Iowa Airport, they came by cars to the Amanas while on their way to Des Moines. The entire group, about 25 first had supper

at the Ox Yoke and then toured the Amana Heritage Museum.

Agri Tourism Site in Development – A farm-oriented play area, hay bale slide, corn maze and more has been noted in a brainstorming session to create a farm-based, family play area near the Amana Performing Arts Center and Amana RV Park, Greg Luerkens told the Cedar Rapids Gazette the week of April 18.

New Life for APAC – The first of several 2022 theater productions and events including a summer 2022 farmer's market and Friday evening bluegrass performances began with "Weekend Comedy" May 20 – 22 at the former OCTC Theatre.

CCA Hires New Superintendent – The Clear Creek Amana School District announced March 1 that Dr. Corey Seymour would be the district's new superintendent replacing Joseph Brown, Sr.

Jingle Cross International Bike Rally Coming Here – Amana Colonies was selected as the site for an international gravel road bike race, August 5 – 7, 2022, Jingle Cross Cycling, Iowa City, announced March 26. The gravel bike race is part of the first Union Cycliste International (UCI) World Series of Gravel. Over 5,000 cyclists from all over the world are expected.

OCTC Board Exits Stage Left – Despite announcing last summer that they would be celebrating the Creamery's 50th anniversary in 2022 and receiving a federal/ state Shuttered Venue Operators Grant for \$437,843, the Old Creamery Theatre Co. board of directors led by Peter Teahan, announced February 4 that it was disbanding the company. The group via its attorney presented the Amana Society with the keys to the theatre building prior to the Amana Society learning from media reports that the group had announced its dissolution.

CO2 Pipeline Meeting Large and at Moments, Heated – January 3 Over 100 people attended the public meeting in Amana at the Price Creek Event Center called by Navigator CO2 Ventures regarding their proposed plan to build a CO2 pipeline across Iowa. AMANA COLONIES LAND USE DISTRICT Ordinance 2022-01

An ordinance amending the Amana Colonies Land Use District Code of Ordinances

(Reference Land Use Plan, Phase II – Division 3.0 – Zoning and Subdivision Ordinances)

Be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Amana Colonies Land Use District by a vote at their December 12, 2022 Regular Meeting that effective January 1, 2023, Section 31.18.020(H) for R-1 parcels, and Section 31.36.060(B1k) for HP-R parcels be amended to include the following changes regarding having chickens, ducks and geese on these parcels. The amendment to the ordinances reads as follows:

H. Agricultural uses, including nurseries, greenhouses and truck gardens provided that no offensive odors or dust are created and provided further, that no retail sales or the raising and keeping of livestock shall be permitted on the premises.

I. Chickens, ducks and geese may be kept on the property as long as there are no more than 15. No roosters are allowed. Please reference Iowa County, Ordinance No. 18, for regulations regarding animal welfare and containment. Containment structures shall comply with the applicable district ordinances.

It was moved by Peter Hoehnle and seconded by Lynn Trumpold that the ordinance amendment be adopted. The motion passed unanimously with the following Trustees present and voting: Joe Parcell, Bruce Trumpold, Tyler Stockman, Norine Magee, Moses de los Santos, Peter Hoehnle and Lynn Trumpold.
