April – 2015 Hydrangeas on Bride's Box By Beth Stodieck

I am so sorry I had to miss the March program but I had an opportunity to hear a seminar by the soldier on which the book and movie, Lone Survivor, were based as part of the Global Nursing Conference in Houston that same day and I just couldn't pass it up. I have a completely new understanding of the term "PTSD". I've talked to several folks about the meeting I've heard nothing but rave reviews of Yvonne's butterfly so it sounds like you had a wonderful time. I'm just really sorry I missed it because I LOVE butterflies! Many thanks to Yvonne.

This month we will work on my Hydrangea box. I taught this project in San Angelo recently and I can promise you there is no way we can do the whole thing in one evening. However, we can work on one of each element in the pattern (attached) and, after seeing the techniques I use, you can finish up at home. The idea is to learn an easy way to do these beautiful flowers so you can recreate them as needed. Feel free to cut up the pattern and do only portions of it but the project is designed around a white or very light background so please have at least that well dried before arriving. I have included instructions on how to apply the stripes if you'd like to do so before class. Having your pattern on will help us get started straight away. We will not have time to do the lace instructions listed in the pattern but maybe we can make that a Saturday Special sometime. Learning how to adapt a lace pattern to your piece. It's really fun when you figure out how easy it is to adapt a design.

As you may have noticed, our project schedule took an unscheduled detour when LaRue taught her last class and brought an adorable fantasy flower tote bag as another example of fabric painting. Everyone who saw it wanted to know when we could paint it so we moved her ornament to the fall and scheduled the tote bag for May. The sample was on denim but I'm sure any dark fabric surface would work. We'll have more info in the next newsletter and you can see the tote bag in the project photos later in this newsletter.

If you have any questions about the hydrangeas, please feel free to shoot me an email. I'll get back to you asap. Hope to see every single one of you painting for joy in April! Those hydrangeas can't help but bring a smile to your face! Beth

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Butterfly Shirt by Sandy Aubuchon taught by Nancy Genetti

Surface: Original was a man's shirt (Wall Mart about \$13.00) woven fabric in color of choice. Originals done on black and royal blue, dark colors work best. This design doesn't lend itself to denim, but try it you might like it! Or you could paint on a ladies blouse, tote bag, apron, etc. It is much easier on a woven shirt rather than a T-shirt or sweatshirt. Wash and dry without the addition of fabric softener. Shirt looks more feminine shortened and hemmed. Iron freezer paper to reverse side of fabric or secure to a shirt board (I use plastic covered canvas boards). Bring a board to class to put between layers of shirt if you ironed freezer paper on the back. This will make it easier to paint.

Pattern is transferred with new white graphite transfer paper. I arranged the flowers and leaves as I painted them, transferring a few at a time. We can do this in class, unless want to design and place yours at home. My shirt was fairly full of painting when I decided to embellish it. You might keep that in mind, doing less painting and having more room to embellish.

Now for the fun! Bring all kinds of embellishments.....pretty buttons, butterflys, bee or flower shaped buttons, small doilies, pins, old jewelry, lace (I added wide lace to bottom of shirt), button and other trims from the fabric department etc. JoAnns and Hobby Lobby have a lot of trims, buttons, items in the scrapbooking section, etc. Antique buttons would be wonderful. Anything you can think of. We might want to all share and trade with each other. You might want straight pins and safety pins to plan your embellishment placement. Glitter anyone?

Deco Art So Soft Fabric paints are used: (Acrylics with fabric medium or other brands of fabric paint may be substituted - whatever you use, you need a fabric medium that goes with the particular paint)

Transparent Medium (must have for this technique)

Island Blue

Dark Rose

Hauser Light Green

Avocado Green

White

True Blue

Renaissance Brown

Alizarin Crimson

The newer Deco Art So Soft Fine Glitter paint is fun to use

Bring soft brushes - white nylon on your regular acrylic brushes. If painting on heavy canvas, etc. you might want stiffer brushes.

The following size brushes were used: #6 flat, #8 filberts, 3/4" Angle, 5/0 liner, stipple brush

Bring brushes you are comfortable with

White Chalk pencil, sharpener

I usually cover the back side of my shirt with a plastic bag . I insert the shirt on the shirt board into the bag, tape around the edges then cut the bag out around the design; Protects from accidents.

Bring other general painting supplies - water bucket, palette, paper towels, etc.



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April Project—Hydrangeas with Beth

HYDRANGEA BRIDE'S BOX

adapted from a Ros Stallcup book, Gran's Pantry, by Beth Stodieck

Please consider buying Ros' book, <u>Gran's Pantry</u>, for more detailed instructions for this and other projects. She provides unparalleled step by step instructions and designs for all of her flowers and fruits in all of her books. I have the whole series and use them regularly for reference. The designs, the instructions and the lady who provides them are all delightful!

PAINTS: All are DecoArt unless noted

Avocado Blue Mist Blue Violet Cad Yellow Dioxazine Purple Evergreen Olive Green Payne's Grey Raw Sienna Titanium White

Victoria Blue Warm White

I wanted a bit of "bling" for this bride's box so I did my stripes and the edge of the lid in Folk Art Metallic Blue Pearl and then added tints of this to leaves to tie it all together. If you don't have or want this, Victoria Blue is the main blue in the hydrangeas so use this. Another interesting idea would be the Cad Yellow since the daisies have CY in the centers. This would be much bolder but could be very interesting.

Optional: Blending and Glazing Medium in the brand of your choice if you choose for doing glazed highlights, tints and squishy leaves.

BRUSHES: good quality except for scruffy
3/4" scruffy round or angle bristle brush for tapping in foliage
Flat brushes, medium to large sizes, for ribbons and squishy leaves
Round or filberts – an assortment of medium to med large sizes for flower petals.

(I use rounds.)

Basecoat your surface with at least 2 coats of Titanium White and lightly sand after 2nd coat with brown paper. I am painting a sample on a rusty old tray. I cleaned it very well, twice, and rinsed it well. I baked it in a low temp oven for about an hour to make sure it was dry and used white spray primer before base coating. You do not need to do a lot of sanding when you use the primer coat, just make sure it is completely clean. My new favorite is RUSTOLEUM 2X PRIMER. I love the 2X gloss varnish, too. Available at WM and Home Depot.

Adjust the grid lines using the grid instructions, included, and paint them on your surface as you desire.

When transferring this pattern, enlarge or shrink as needed for your surface.

Transfer leaves and ribbons as shown.

Only transfer the DAISY CENTERS, NOT the petals. You will freehand them.

Only transfer VERY LIGHTLY the outlines of the hydrangeas, possibly even a bit smaller than the pattern lines. Your flowers may be a little bigger or smaller than my outlines and you do not want to have to fight leftover pattern lines.

WE WILL discuss how to do a lace border during class. Because we will be working on so many different surfaces, there is no way I can make one pattern that would work for all of us.

SPACING GRID LINES ON OVAL BOX Beth Stodieck © 2014

STEP 1:

Trace the lid of your box and cut out the tracing. This does not need to be on tracing paper.

STEP 2:

and horizontally, matching edges carefully so you have true center each way, and open back up.

STEP 3:

Fold one edge to the center mark on your sheet, matching center line to center line, and crease. Repeat with the other side.

STEP 4:

Fold bottom edge up to center line, matching center line to center line, and crease. Repeat with the top.

STEP 5: You now have V1, V2, H1, and H2.

EASY WAY TO MAKE STRIPES

STEP 6: Decide which side of these lines you want your grid to be on. You'd like to have a little corner of white showing in each corner as shown in the drawing.

STEP 7: Place a piece of tape the width of your stripe ON THE AREA YOU WANT YOUR STRIPE.

STEP 8: Place another strip of tape on each side of the first piece.


STEP 9: Remove the center piece of tape and firmly press down on the inside edges of remaining 2 tape pieces.

STEP 10: Let this stripe dry completely while you do the mirrored stripe on the other end of the box.

STEP 11: When these 2 stripes are dry, repeat on the other pair of stripes.

STEP 12: Gently touch up any areas where paint bled through under the tape.

STEP 13: Let dry completely and apply pattern as instructed.

Recipe Corner



LASAGNA

8 oz. Lasagna noodles (9)

1 1/2 # ground beef

1 1/2 jar of spaghetti sauce (26 oz. jar) (I used the kind with garlic and basil)

1 egg beaten

3/4 # ricotta cheese

3 cups shredded part skim mozzarella cheese divided-

(2 1/4 c and 3/4 c for topping)

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp black pepper

1/ 2 Tablespoon dried parsley flakes

1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese

Cook noodles according to package instructions.

In Dutch oven cook beef until no pink, drain. Remove from heat, stir in spaghetti sauce.

In a large bowl, combine egg, ricotta cheese, 2 1/4 c mozzarella cheese, parsley, salt, pepper.

Drain noodles, spread 1 cup meat sauce in greased 13x9 baking dish.

Layer with 3 noodles, then 1 cup ricotta mixture and 1 1/2 cup meat sauce.

Repeat layers twice. Top with parmesan cheese and remaining mozzarella cheese.

Cover and bake at 375% for 45 minutes. Uncover and cook 10 minutes longer, cool and cut.

This can be doubled and put one dish in the freezer for later.


