

#### **Summer Greetings!**

Prayer is one of the ways that we communicate with God, who is always present with us, and who resides within our very hearts through the Holy Spirit. The apostle Paul, wrote in his final comments to the church in Thessalonica, "<sup>16</sup> Rejoice always, <sup>17</sup> pray without ceasing, <sup>18</sup> give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. <sup>19</sup> Do not quench the Spirit. <sup>20</sup> Do not despise prophecies, <sup>21</sup> but test everything; hold fast to what is good; <sup>22</sup> abstain from every form of evil." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-22)

We've been talking over the past few weeks about getting to know one another better through having deeper conversations, listening intently, and asking thoughtful, caring questions. Conversation is one of our main channels of communication with others, and just as our relationships grow and strengthen with others through conversation, our relationship with God also grows as we practice communication and conversation through prayer and meditation.

There are many ways to pray, and we may find that we have all different kinds of conversations with God. We can recite The Lord's Prayer at any time during our day, as it was given to us by Jesus when his disciples asked him how to pray. We can also create our own prayers, and when we don't have words of our own, there are many other wonderful prayers, already written that we may pray, including The Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi, The Lorica of St. Patrick, the Psalms, and The Serenity Prayer just to name a few. Our prayers may also be a casual conversation with God, like we're talking to a friend, or they may be just a couple of words. Two of the shortest and greatest prayers are, Thank-you God! and God please help!

Whatever words we use, or don't use (because silence is also prayer), when we pray, we're reaching out, and connecting intentionally with God. When we open these lines of communication with God, our hearts and minds are opened to see and experience the love, joy, power, compassion, forgiveness, and care of God, who hears and answers our prayers. If you're new to prayer, try it. Ask God for help. If you have a prayer practice, keep it up. Ask God for help. God delights when we reach out.

We now have a prayer room at St. Paul's, first door on the right, behind fellowship hall. Next time you're in church, walk back and check it out. Pop your head in, or walk right in and sit down, turn on the battery candles, take your shoes off and stay a while......We're Creating the prayer space as a faith community, for the entire community, so please accept this invitation to make yourself at home here anytime. Come to pray, reflect, meditate, or to just be.



# We're Paving the way....for new church growth and saying goodbye to the potholes!

Our parking lot is going to be repaired! The Congregation Council has accepted a contract for \$15,350.00 for this work. The work will take a few days and will be completed during the next few weeks. To help fund this project Council has stopped the fund drive to pay down on the Thrivent Financial mortgage. Instead, they're requesting that any contributions that would have been donated for mortgage reduction now be donated toward the parking lot repairs. The balance needed will be withdrawn from our accumulated savings currently invested with Thrivent.

Over the last several months you have paid an additional \$9350.00 against our mortgage balance. *Thank you*. At this time, we receive enough money through regular giving to cover the monthly mortgage payment.

The funding thermometer will again be present in the sanctuary to show the monies being raised to meet our goal.





#### RACIAL JUSTICE TRAINING FOR ROSTERED LEADERS

As per "Resolution: Anti-Racism Education Emphasis" submitted to the 2022 Synod Assembly and passed at the July 2022 meeting of the Synod Council, all NEPA Synod rostered leaders (pastors and deacons) and synodically authorized lay leaders are required to have Anti-Racism Training at least every 3 years, at the same cost as Boundary Training. To help meet this requirement, the Synod Racial Justice Team has scheduled two training events for Fall 2023, for those who were not able to attend one of the Winter 2023 sessions. \*\*Lay Leaders are also welcome to attend.\*\*



The eHarmony of Prison Reentry

#### STORYTELLING ENGAGEMENT

A story from our Grand Canyon Synod

Over 600,000 people are released from prison every year, and as they struggle to rejoin society, they face barriers to connecting with reentry service providers. We are honored that so many of our synods and congregations are active in prison ministry; yet they know the challenge of finding reliable and effective resources to support folks once they've been released.

Our synods are supporting reentry ministry: the Metropolitan Chicago Synod helped start the work and the Grand Canyon Synod has launched the innovative online resource the Inside Out Network (ION), a one-of-a-kind platform that helps returning citizens connect with the support they need for a successful reentry. The Grand Canyon Synod has made a strong commitment, awarding ION an "Adapting, Connecting, Transforming and Sustaining" grant so it can help people access ministries and service providers.

ION is a bit like eHarmony: returning citizens and service providers can find each other and exchange messages, even before release, to make sure returning citizens get the support they need as soon after release as possible. What started as a prison ministry from an ELCA church in the Chicago area is now operating in Illinois and Arizona and launching soon in Oregon, with 6,400 returning citizens and 443 service providers and ministries enrolled. ION is always free to returning citizens, and service providers participate free of charge for a year before paying a modest annual fee.

With the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions, ION has gone into Arizona prisons to train staff on using the platform. This has led to inmates enrolling before their release; reports indicate that as release approaches, they are less anxious, seeing ahead of time what help will be available.

ION values its partnerships with ministry and is currently developing a Reentry Congregational Initiative, gathering insights from faith communities that intentionally minister to returning citizens. Many ELCA congregations work in this area, and we welcome any insights they might provide by completing this <u>survey</u> (https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/SLFWMLS). ION intends to develop a guidebook called "Effective Reentry Ministry for Ordinary Congregations"; its valuable "Spiritual Survival Guide for Prison and Beyond" can be read or downloaded free of charge from the ION website at insideoutnetwork.net/resources.
