It is the time of the year to emphasize participation in the Program Coordinator's contests. The Program Coordinator should complete the Yearly Subordinate Lecturer's Form and if you held a Community Night (Open House) program. This form was sent to your Secretary for distribution to you. The completion of the Lecturer's Form provides our State Program Coordinator with knowledge to move forward for another year. Even though you might not have done everything listed on the form, you can provide ideas, comments or suggestions for next year. The deadline for this form is September 15. If you plan on submitting a scrapbook, the deadline is also September 15.

The various craft, art and photography contests are:

Container Pot Decorating (Maximum Size: 8 inches and empty – 3 Categories: Funny, Pretty, and Grange Theme.

Tissue Box Covers – 3 Categories: Holiday/Seasonal, Most Creative, and Grange Theme. For each category, create tissue box covers from fabric, card stock, or yarn.

Craft Stick Art (New) – Maximum Size: 6: L x 6" W (no height limit) – 3 Categories: Prettiest, Funniest, and Most Creative. Wreaths – Maximum Size: 18" in diameter – 3 Categories: Holiday, Pretty, Grange Theme

Both Juniors and Subordinate members may enter in the above contests.

My Favorite Anything – Maximum Size: 2' x 2' x 2'. There are 4 categories: Wood, Plastic, Material/Yarn, and Miscellaneous.

Art – There are four categories in this area: Nature, Animals, Abstract, People, and Street Art/Graffiti on canvas.

Photography – Pennsylvania-My Home (scenes, sights & people from PA), Sunrise/Sunset, Pets/Animals, Plants (trees, shrubs, flowers) and Churches.

Miscellaneous Photos – Digitally enhanced photography, Photo Collage, Photo Gallery/Slide Show/Story Board.

Pen In Hand – There are 3 topics: Poetry (300 words max), Short Story (1,500 words max), and Read a Book (500 words max). These entries must be original work of person submitting the writing. The State Lecturer must receive the Pen In Hand entries by September 15. They writing must be typed, space and a half or double spaced, on 8-1/2" x 11" unlined paper. Many acres have been enrolled in 'Prevent Plant' where farmers can't even plant a crop due to wet soil. Most agree that USDA has over-estimated how many acres have actually been planted, resulting in lower market prices for corn. Still, some experts say to just ignore USDA reports as the markets will correct themselves when the crop is harvested. Let's hope for more normal weather in the weeks leading up to harvest.
