# German-American HISTORY 101

## Wright or Wrong?

Today we remember Gustave Albin Whitehead, born Gustav Albin Weisskopf (January 1, 1874 – October 10, 1927) Gustave was a German-Bavarian aviation pioneer who emigrated from Leutershausen, Germany to the United States where he designed and built early flying machines and engines from 1897 to 1915. At the beginning of his career in 1897, Whitehead married a Donauschwaben girl named, Louisa Tuba, in Buffalo, New York. At the time of his marriage, he listed his occupation as "Aeronaut".



For decades, controversy has surrounded press reports, eyewitness accounts and Whitehead's own claims that he flew his powered airplanes several times in 1901 and 1902, predating the first flights made by the Wright Brothers in 1903. Overwhelming evidence proves this to be true, which means that a German Immigrant was the first man in America to fly a plane.

Sadly on October 10, 1927, Gustave Whitehead, at the young age of 53, died of a heart attack leaving his family with their self-built home and only \$8.00 in cash. He was buried in a pauper's grave, unfitting for such a great man.

A very notable researcher and promoter of Whitehead's place in Aviation History is William J. O'Dwyer, a reserve officer of the U.S. Air force, who discovered unknown photos of the airplanes in 1963 and has dedicated himself to research on this subject ever since.

In the year 1964, Whitehead was posthumously honored by the State of Connecticut, and his grave received a proper headstone. In 1980, the Gustave Weisskopf Museum in Leutershausen (Germany) opened providing the most comprehensive collection of proof of the accomplishments of Gustave Whitehead as a pioneer of motorized flight. Also in the 1980's and 90's, replica-versions of his aircraft Number 21 were flown in both the U.S. and Germany, proving that his planes were capable of flying.
