DO I HAVE THE COURAGE TO TURN TO THE LIGHT OF CHRIST?



"The Lord looks into the heart," God tells Samuel (1Samuel 16:7), explaining why Eliab is not qualified for anointing despite his outward appearance. Wonderful news for David, but challenging news for all of us. Is our heart ready for such an examination? Or is it more comfortable in the darkness? Opening our hearts to the Lord, choosing to live as children of the light, helps us produce "every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth" (Ephesians 5:9). Then may we feel the Holy Spirit rush upon us.

Because of how difficult it was for the man born blind to live with this disability for his entire childhood and much of his adulthood, his ability to see was so much sweeter. For the Pharisees, believing they had perfect vision to begin with, seeing something that challenged their beliefs and attitudes was unpleasant. Believing that this man who does not keep the Sabbath came from God was difficult to accept. Believing that the man born blind could speak with any authority went so far. So they chose not to accept what they witnessed with their very eyes. They chose to remain blind to the truth because it was easier to live in the illusion that they already had perfect vision.

"You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" (John 9:34).

The Pharisees indignantly reject the testimony of the healed man. Ironically, however, they are right. What they fail to realize, however, is that we are all born in sin, with original sin, Adam and Eve's legacy. The Pharisees were born equally in sin, in the early Christian era, baptism was often called "illumination." In baptism, the believer is illumined by the light of



Christ. We all come out of darkness. Let the light of Christ we received in baptism illuminate our lives.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

Do I have the courage to examine my heart in the light of Christ and turn away from all that blinds me to goodness, righteousness, and truth?

We are traditionally asked to run drives during holiday periods when the need for blood is great and the donations are usually down. Your support is just one of many things that make St. Bart's special. Tell your family and friends too.

Lenten Almsgiving Religious Ed Project Imagine your child at the age of 10 being orphaned because of 20 years of war in your country. He is now scavenging through scraps that people throw away to find food and living in the streets. Homelessness among children is a particularly acute problem in South Sudan, with many children living in the streets, cemeteries, markets, etc. They are often subject to violence and exploitation.

Why am I telling you this? For the past 15 or so years, each Lent we sponsor a Lenten almsgiving project that benefits various missions run by the Missionary Society of St Paul, commonly known as MSP, which is the order in



which the priests of our parish belong. During Lent the money we save from what we give up is meant to be used to help the poor. This year we plan to help children in war torn South Sudan at an MSP mission.

In a small way, the MSP Fathers try to help these street children at their South Sudan Mission. They presently have rescued 25 young boys between the ages of 10 and 15 from the streets. The 25 boys rescued from the streets will receive an education at the MSP Fathers school program which is considered the best school in the state. They will have food to eat, a shelter where they can lay their heads at night and health care in a country where children die from diseases easily cured. Last year through our Lenten almsgiving we were able to provide the MSP Fathers will donations to care for five children for the year. It presently cost approximately \$450 per year for each child.

I am asking every family in our parish to consider joining us this year by either picking up an almsgiving container in the back of the church on Ash Wednesday or making your own at home from an empty can, plastic container, or zip lock bag. Each day place the change you saved by what you and your family give up for Lent in the container. At the end of Lent, right after Easter, return the container to us. If we each do our small part, collectively we can make the world a better place one child at a time. *Thank you. Cheryl Duda*
