Strasburg 150th Celebration June 14-16, 2024

A Strasburg history book is being prepared to highlight the history of Strasburg during the last 25 years (1999-2024). Also included is a section of stories where individuals share their memories of living, growing up, or visiting Strasburg. The Strasburg history book will be available for sale during the 150th Celebration June 14-16, 2024.

Below are some excerpts from a few stories that will be included in the book.

Halloween Desserts by Eli Dollarhide:

"The real highlight of the Halloween celebration was the cakewalk. Just the

word ignited excitement. Once the costume judging was complete, some of the Legion members would throw down a large set of particle board numbered tiles onto the road, arranged into a hollow square. Someone would dust off a boom box and some tapes - - I feel there like there was a lot of Garth Brooks - - and the game was off."

Recollections of Strasburg Life by Chris Storm:

"My father, George E. Kull, was Strasburg's postmaster for 23 years (1934-1957)... My mother's birth flower was Lily of the Valley for May. A large clump of the flowers covered a 6-8' area at the back of the post office. In our farmyard eighty years later, we still have some of those flowers.

Mincemeat and Holiday Cookies by Cinda Held:

"My grandma Rosie Rincker was known for two things around her community: her holiday cookies and mincemeat...

(Mincemeat) What is that you ask...? Well, it's cooked soup bone, head meat and other cooked cuts from beef. It is cooked until it is so tender that it can be pulled from the bone. Then raisins, currents, sugar and leftover holiday hard candy was added, and it continued to cook until it became soft and caramelized. Grandma Rosie cooked it for mincemeat pies. People from as far as Decatur bought her mincemeat for the holidays. For some it was a real treat. For others, not so much."

Precious Memories of Time at Grandma and Grandpa's by Abby (Rincker) Warden:

"Many hours were spent outside pretending to play and gazing upon the cattle, believing they enjoyed the songs I sang to them. At least, they never told me otherwise." **Adventures in Firefighting by Charlie Culver:** "Charlie's loyal canine, Radar, a beagle mix, provided more entertainment for the department. One day a call came through and Radar hopped in the truck with Charlie to go to the Firehouse. While Charlie put on his gear, he instructed Radar, "You stay in my truck." Charlie said, "His long ears were just a-floppin, cars were pullin' over, and there's this long-eared dog running down the road behind the firetruck!""






