The arena of human resources offers a wide range of career opportunities in the workforce today. The profession has common core practices and goals. Human resources careers are remarkably diverse.

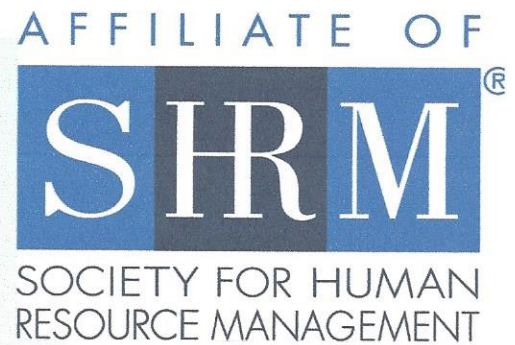
At www.shrm.org, the benefits of joining SHRM as a student member are substantial. According to SHRM,

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Students who are enrolled in their final year of an undergraduate or graduate degree program at a college or university that has been approved by SHRM’s Academic Initiatives staff as being aligned to SHRM’s curriculum guidelines are eligible to sit for the SHRM-CP exam.
