Jade Mist Taliesin She's So Fine "Sophie" 12/12/2007 – 9/6/19

PVSSC members and friends extend deepest sympathy to Linda and Dan McClure who lost their sweet Sophie on September 6.

Sophie had had surgery on August 28 to remove a mammary tumor and a newly found enlarged lymph node. The surgery was a lot harder on her than anyone thought. Sophie already was suffering from chronic renal failure but had been stable for a while so they flooded her with fluids and proceeded.

Both tumors came back negative for cancer. However the damage had been done and for the ten days following the surgery she ate very little solid food. Linda and Dan had to give her sub-Q fluids daily and appetite enhancers but they had limited success.

On Thursday evening, September 5 she started having problems walking and this progressed to her constantly pacing, running into things, trying to stand in corners, and being very unresponsive to us. Linda and Dan made the decision to put her to rest as she no longer had "quality of life."

All of this while dealing with hurricane Dorian, which by the way, Linda and Dan and their three remaining Shelties are fine. An added note, they lost their Morgan just this past May. It is difficult losing a dog, but two within four months is a horrible ordeal.

SHELTIES AND CAVITIES

I just read this in an article "...cavities are rare in dogs. Dogs typically don't get cavities for several reasons: Canine oral bacteria are different from ours. They tend not to cause acid build up that harms teeth."

Cavities are rare and often times when routine teeth cleaning is done by a veterinarian, they have never seen cavities so they don't recognize when a cavity is starting.

This past May, when our dogs' had their annual teeth cleaning, our veterinarian, Dr. DeBolt, found Savannah had a large cavity and several smaller ones. This was a surprise. Dr. DeBolt said she has been doing teeth

cleaning and extractions for 20 years and this is the first time she saw cavities in a dog's mouth.

We took Savannah to Dr. Wade Gingerich of the Pet Dental Center in Bonita Springs, FL. He told us he sees several Shelties. He mentioned he believes Shelties suffer from cavities because of their long, narrow muzzles and because Shelties, compared to other breeds, have dry mouth. The narrow muzzle causes food to get lodged in the back of their mouths and it just sits there and along with the lack of saliva, limits the natural processes of breaking down the bacteria.

The PVSSC January Program was Canine Dental, where several members demonstrated how they brush their dogs' teeth and identified products they use. Savannah needed a root canal done on a front tooth, but because of the shape of the nerves, we decided to have the tooth extracted, along with the tooth in the above photo with the large cavity. In addition to the two teeth extractions, Savannah had three fillings for cavities.

She is doing great – she must have been in so much pain from the cavities. And some of her problems have cleared – as with humans there is evidence of a link between gum disease and other chronic illnesses. Mollie also has a cavity and will have her teeth worked on in November.
