

PAYMENT OPTIONS AVAILABLE

- * Online Banking
- * Postdated Cheques
- * Mail in Cheques
- * Cash/Cheque at the Front Counter

For your convenience, you can pay your Property Tax and Water/Sewer bills with online banking if you hold accounts with CIBC, Northern Credit Union or Scotiabank. Payments can be made at any time, in full or in part, and can also be set up to come out on a regular schedule and amount of your choosing.

To set up online payments with **CIBC**:

Property Taxes: Payee shown as Hornepayne (Township of) Tax
Water & Sewer: Payee shown as Hornepayne (Township) Utility

To set up online payments with **Northern Credit Union**:

Property Taxes: Payee shown as Hornepayne Township – Property Tax
Water & Sewer: Payee shown as Hornepayne Township Utility

To set up online payments with **Scotiabank**:

Property Taxes: Payee shown as Township of Hornepayne Taxes
Water & Sewer: Payee shown as Township of Hornepayne Utility

When setting up your online banking, the entire 19 digit account # will be required for Property Taxes.
i.e. 5796000001234000000.

For Water & Sewer (Utilities) at the **CIBC**, an 11 digit account # is required; this is the 8 digit account # in addition to 3 zeros at the end.
i.e. 1234 0000 000.

For Water & Sewer (Utilities) at the **Northern Credit Union and Scotiabank**, the 8 digit account # is required.
i.e. 1234 0000.

These account numbers can be found on the respective bills or you can call our office and our staff will gladly provide you with the appropriate account number.

Leaving post-dated cheques in our fire-proof lock-up is also another way to ensure regular payments while easing the pressure of having to come up with large lump sums on due dates.

Of course, we are always happy to serve you in person.
