ST. GREGORY PALAMAS

Our father among the Saints Gregory Palamas (1296-1359), Archbishop of Thessalonica, was a monk of Mount Athos in Greece, and later became Archbishop of Thessalonica. He was a preeminent theologian and a proponent of hesychastic theology. In Orthodox Christianity, it is type of monastic life in which practitioners seek divine quietness (Greek *hēsychia*) through the contemplation of God in uninterrupted prayer.

St. John Climacus, one of the greatest writers of the Hesychast tradition, wrote, "Let the




remembrance of Jesus be present with each breath, and then you will know the value of the *hēsychia*." Hesychasm was violently attacked in the first half of the 14th century by Barlaam (Varlaam) the Calabrian. St. Gregory Palamas defended the Hesychast monks. The teachings of Palamas were confirmed by the Orthodox Church in a series of councils held in Constantinople (1341, 1347, 1351).





The Lenten Prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian


O Lord and Master of my life! Take from me the spirit of sloth, faint-heartedness, lust of power, and idle talk. (prostration)
