
Thanks to Rod Stabler for remembering that he won the last WWTW and bringing in a turning. The winner was Lee Burkholder.

Maintenance Department

Maintenance Department #5 Lighting in the Shop - Converting Fluorescent Fixtures to LED

As we age lighting becomes more and more important. There are several ways to improve shop lighting. More lights, higher wattage bulbs, dedicated task lighting and converting to LED. Today we will address the LED option.

Most of us have the typical 4' fluorescent light fixtures in our shop. These can easily be replaced with similar LED fixtures, but this can be an expensive decision. Although LEDs use less electricity it takes a long time to recoup your investment. One big plus with LEDs is that they do not use ballasts. We can use this to our advantage. In years past a failed ballast usually was repaired by buying a new fixture. This was because there was little difference in the cost of a fixture and the cost of a replacement ballast. In fact, the fixture was often cheaper.

I recently took a fixture with a failed ballast and in less than 10 minutes refitted it with LED bulbs. There are several different type bulbs so be sure to buy the correct ones. I purchased 25 through Amazon for about five dollars each. They are the no-ballast style that require power from both ends,

This is a simple job:

Remove the bulbs and cover to gain access to the ballast.



Cut the wires near the ballast and remove it. I would not eat finger food during this operation and wash up before I do.



Connect the wires that fed the ballast (hot and neutral) to the wires going to the sockets. One to one end and one to the other. Wire-nut the connections and replace the cover.



Install the bulbs and test. This is when you find out if you bought the correct bulbs.



For about ten dollars you have a fixture that will provide more light and never needs a ballast.
