Monthly Fiscal Report: We just completed the second month of this fiscal year and using a benchmark of 16.67% we have received 15.5% of our non- property tax revenues while we have expended 15.64%. Also, two accounts were incorrectly charged amounts due in other accounts. This was initially raised in review by our Select Board oversight of the treasurer's warrants and have since been adjusted. The first charge was in our general government and the annual membership for GPCOG should have been charged to its own account. The second was under our general insurances and with the insurer provided a blanket we normally should have charged the surety bonds to general insurance. This too has been corrected and the bottom line of the month to date expenses has not changed.

MDOT RT. 302 Project Hearing: The Final public hearing will be held regarding the proposed reconstruction of the portion of Rt. 302 from the Stanley Hill Road extending to just before the Stack Em Inn Road in Bridgton will be held on Wed. September 25th from 6-8Pm at the Leura Hill Eastman Performing Arts Center at the Fryeburg Academy Campus on 18 Bradley Street in Fryeburg. The public is invited to provide their testimony.

Electronic Waste Collection: We will periodically remind our citizens and those in the immediate communities of our planned Electronic Waste collection set for October 26th from 9-2 PM at the Depot Street parking lot near the Bridgton Community Center. The following will be collected on that day:

Sewer System Construction Work: The Town has started work on its sewer system. We are currently in the Downtown area and will attempt to do any work on Rt. 302 as quickly as possible and then move to the side streets. Dearborn Construction Company and our engineer's Wright Pierce are determining where water is entering the system and attempting to eliminate that flow to assure that our fields are not getting flooded during high rain and water events. This is the I & I work that has been planned and now being executed. Over the next two months we hope to complete all of the work and restore the travel ways before winter sets in.

Rabies Clinic: The Town's Animal Control Officer is sponsoring a rabies clinic scheduled for Saturday, October 26th from 1-3 pm at the Central fire Station. The cost will be \$10 per animal. Go to our town website www.bridgtonmaine.org for more information.
