NEW CONSTRUCTION

As many of you may have noticed, the old Lion's Club Building has been demolished and a new community building will start going up soon. This is made possible by the Land and Water Conservation Grant which Corydon received in 2017.

PROPERTY TAXES

We would like to give an update on property tax collection efforts since the City started a new tax collection initiative in 2017 with the passage of **§ 2017.01. City of Corydon Ordinance for Ad Valorem Property Tax Rates and Collection Procedures**

Last fiscal year collection was \$15,418.57.
This fiscal year collection is \$21,225.83.

City taxes help to pay for beautification and maintenance of city grounds and property.

NEW BILLIING STATEMENTS

The City is implementing a new software program for government / sewer billing and payment collection. Please take note, there will probably be a change on the look of your sewer bill and/or property tax bill. Hopefully, you should see the change with April's bill.

DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE

§ DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE: It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog, regardless of the age of dog, to allow the dog to be at large and unattended or to run in any street, park, lawn, garden, schoolyard, playground, or on any other public or private property.

§ PENALTY: Any person who violates any provision of this chapter for which another penalty is not already provided shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not more than \$500.00 for each offense. Each day the violation exists shall constitute a separate offense.

The City has received complaints concerning dogs running loose. For those who have dogs, please ensure that they are secured and not wandering loose. It could cost you.

RURAL DEVELOPMENT-USDA

The City is working with the US Department of Agriculture to offer affordable home loans for various reasons.

Rural Home Loans assists low income applicants obtain decent and safe housing in eligible rural areas by providing payment assistance to increase an applicant's repayment ability.

Single Family Repair Loans & Grants Provides loans to very low income homeowners to repair or improve their home or provides grants to elderly low income homeowners to remove safety and health hazards.

Rural Home Loans assists low income applicants to obtain decent, safe and sanitary housing in eligible rural areas to those who can furnish a modest housing site.

Those who are interested can pick up information and application at City Hall or at the Food Bank.

Please take advantage of these programs if you are in need of one of these services.

ONE MORE THING...

A reminder for those who will be filling a pool this summer. Before you begin read the water meter & after you finish read the water meter. Bring readings with the date pool filled to City Hall. We have to have both readings to calculate your adjustment. **No meter reading=no adjustment.** If you need instructions on reading your water meter, drop by City Hall and pick up copy.
