As we continue on our journey into Lent, the question arises, "How do we observe Lent with genuine authenticity?" This newsletter article will be a brief reflection on that question that aspires to move beyond superficial observances such as giving up chocolate, only to binge on chocolate sweets when Easter comes around.

Lent is about re-living the process of committing your life to God. It is essentially a recommitment process, renewing one's vow of baptism.

One of the 12 steps of Alcoholics Anonymous is "Did a fearless moral inventory of all my defects." The next step is "Asked "Higher Power" to help me remove them."

This is more genuinely the purpose of Lent: to provide a community time of reflection on ways in which we may have fallen short in our devotion to God and to ask God for help in turning our lives back around. This of course is a constant process for every Christian. We constantly fall away and return. Lent is simply a special season devoted to repentance and then experiencing the wonderful grace of new life and resurrection. The events of Easter and the Passion, the whole world rejecting God's love in Christ in every way and hanging him on a cross, torturing love, hating love, ignoring love, preferring other concerns to love. Only to have God love us back anyway, providing a new life, a connected life, a life at one with the purpose, meaning, and salvation of love. So at one with love, that Holy union with God occurs and imparts to us the eternal nature of Love. Eternal Being. Eternal Love.

It is the process of grounding ourselves in that love that "removes our defects" when we ask for help.

Which defects act as a poison to your relationships, your vocation, your health, your finances, and your sense of what is right? Which habits have a toxic effect on your well-being, your family, your community, and the planet?

Lent is that time to choose again to be free of those toxins and relish the joy, love, and vast community connection that comes with the oneness of spirit and love itself. Ultimately it is not a choice to give up something, but a choice to gain everything. Everything that matters, that is real, has substance and won't pass away. We gain eternal love and eternal life.

My sermon series for Lent follows a novice in his decision to get baptized in the first century of Christian community evolution. It will also follow an elder and another follower who have fallen away and find in Lent, a time of renewal. This set of serial sermons will culminate in the joy and celebration of Easter. I hope this journey will be as meaningful to you as it has been for me, as I have reflected on my baptism vows while preparing this Lenten sermon series.
